
STOP THE NEWTOWN SEWER PLANT

BACKGROUND

- The Newtown Sewer Authority purchased 17.5 acres of land right next door to the Wawa under construction along the Newtown Bypass and plans to build a new, 2.5 MILLION gallon per day sewer plant.
- The Sewer Authority used to run a sewer plant, but closed it in 1988 to "regionalize" wastewater treatment at the urging of the Pa. Department of Environmental Protection.
- Newtown wastewater has been directed safely to a Philadelphia treatment plant over the past 36 years through the Bucks County Water & Sewer Authority (BCWSA)

HOW DOES THIS AFFECT ME?

- 12,000 residents and dozens if not hundreds of businesses are within 1.5 miles of the proposed plant with potential odor and truck traffic impacts.
- If Newtown leaves the BCWSA regional system, all future costs for Newtown Township and Borough sewage treatment will be paid for EXCLUSIVELY by the 9,000 Newtown customers instead of SHARED by the 100,000 customers in the BCWSA regional system.
- The plant will dispose the treated wastewater into Lake Luxembourg, Core Creek, and/or Neshaminy Creek which Middletown Township has poured millions of dollars into protecting and restoring.
- Core Creek Park is a treasure across our entire region of Bucks County; risking negative environmental impacts from a sewer plant is unthinkable.
- More sewer capacity = more development of our already congested area, which is really what this ill-conceived project is all about
- A sewer plant right in our backyard will negatively affect future property value.

WHAT CAN I DO?

A strong, grassroots group is forming to oppose this project. We plan to form an alliance with the local developments and businesses directly within the "stink zone" of this proposed plant (see map).

It is our hope that creating this network will help us to spread accurate and crucial information regarding the sewer plant project to the residents of our neighborhoods.
