A SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO

Jerry Bernstein

"He will be missed by many" "Such a sweet man." "He was a very special guy and so kind & thoughtful!!" "Such a kind man." "Such a gentleman" "Gentle soul and always happy to help you"

These are just a few of the comments posted by fellow guild members on the death of Jerry Bernstein.

Jerry became a member of TBG, in the early days, after taking an OTP class. Although he didn't "do spreadsheets" he ably served the guild as treasurer keeping us on the straight and narrow money wise.

As he was a retired leather worker guild members were excited for him to teach the "mystery" braid. Although no one knew, he didn't have a clue what we were talking about. But he went home and learned so he could share the technique. Most everyone has a leather scissor/knife holder, embossed with the letters TBG, which were his contribution.

He volunteered for many weaving demonstrations and was WONDERFUL with children. Last fall he and I did a demo at the Francis Land House where we dressed in colonial attire. In britches and tricorner hat he was a sight to behold. Not a kid went away with an unfinished basket.

Patience seemed to be his middle name. His daughter in law, Beth, teaches at Tarrallton Elementary School. Poppy, as he was known, volunteered by helping at the book fair and of course teaching basket weaving to the students in her class.

Several years ago I held what was called "at home Fridays". Anyone who wanted to weave or needed help was welcome to come for the day. Jerry was among the many who participated. By the time it was over we had become great friends.

Every so often I would get an email asking what my plans were. If we were both free he would stop at Subway and pick up a sandwich for us to share at lunch. In the beginning we worked on baskets but eventually just sat at the kitchen table and taked. We laughed; we cried and solved all problems of the world. Spanky loved when Jerry came for a visit and would always be sure to sit on the side away from me so I couldn't see the potato chips that were shared.

Jerry and his wife Faye drove their RV to Florida every winter. He always took weaving projects with him to work on during his time in the sun. One day he was working on a basket (Nantucket I think) that included black weavers. When time came to lash the rim he didn't have the appropriate rim filler. So....he removed the black plastic drawstring from a bag of fruit and used it as rim filler.

At his funeral the Rabbi talked of Jerry's love of weaving. He said that those who visited the home should pay particular attention to one of Jerry's baskets that caught his eye. The Porcupine!!!!!

Jerry helped care for Faye during her last illness and when she died some of the spark went out of his life.

They had been married 65 years and had gone to elementary school together. I don't think he could imagine his life without her as a part of it. Beth said that he never made a decision without discussing it with Faye even after she was gone. He carried a chair in his car so he could sit by her grave and "talk things over".

He is, once again, by her side where he longed to be.

Although he is gone from our physical presence he lives on in our hearts and we are all better for having known him.


