WEAVING OPPORTUNITIES

Natural Materials Sampler Basket Class Including supplies is \$65

Students will be exposed to an introduction of the identification, processing and use of a variety of natural basketry materials. They will create a small (6" x 2" x3") rectangular checker work base, mold woven basket with Black ash (Fraxinus nigra) spokes and a combination of natural materials for weavers and rim. Weavers in start-stop rows or twining technique will include Black ash as well as a variety of other native naturals such as sweetgrass, day lily cordage, birch or elm bark. Rims are single lashed to the basket and embellishments may be added if desired. Baskets will be unique, reflecting the choices made by each student.




Have you ever seen a picture of an antique basket in an auction catalog and been inspired? Well that is just what Tony Stubblefield of St. Louis Missouri did.

I have the pleasure of watching Tony weave a quadrifoil fan this past February at John C Campbell Folk School. A lot of planning went into weaving the fan, countless graphs, turning of the handle (multiple ones just in case) and design changes up until the last minute. It took Tony several days to weave the finished product and even had help from fellow students in wood working to get the handle just right. FANCYWORK FAN

Ash basketry work with maple handle, rare quadrifoil center, finely turned handle with two scribe lines towards end. Included with fan is a letter from Sister Frances Carr, Trustee The United Society of Shakers, that certifies that this "Quadrifoil Fan", "was produced in the Shaker Community at Mount Lebanon New York during the fourth quarter of the nineteenth century. It is most likely the work of Sister Cornelia French (1840-1917)". 11 1/2" I, 8" dia.
