A small pair of sharp embroidery scissors is best for waxed linen thread. Other types of scissors just mush the fiber rather than cut it cleanly.



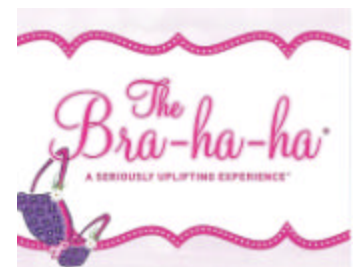
