Below are the position descriptions for Vice President and Treasurer to help you make well-informed nominations:



VICE-PRESIDENT

Shall preside over any meeting at which the president is unable to attend. Shall have primary responsibility for preparing a yearly calendar of events with the president's help, for presenting the calendar to the board for approval, and for contacting/scheduling guest teachers as needed. Shall collect money for the classes and remind participants of their selected classes via meeting announcements. newsletters, emails, and website. Shall maintain a log of volunteers throughout the year to be used for the "volunteer drawings" at the annual pool party. Shall perform other duties as may be assigned by the president.

TREASURER

Shall record and disperse the funds of the guild and shall maintain up-to-date financial reports for presentation at each board meeting. Shall present an annual written financial report to the board and other documentation as required for government filing. Shall keep all records and pass them on to his/her successor.


Sunday, September 9, 2012 Larchmont UMC Fellowship Hall 2:00 p.m.
