Looking ahead to 2012, be ready for an encore opportunity of the previously successful Challenge Basket project. Sign-ups will be in January with a start date in February.

One of our members, **Jean Koon**, currently teaches her signature basket woven from marsh grasses on the Eastern Shore. Fortunately, she has agreed to come to Hampton Roads to teach this basket in February. I'm so excited to see a "natural" class come our way.

Other calendar ideas include: (1) taking a kit and making the basket at home, and then finishing a more challenging rim in class during our regular Sunday meeting; (2) exploring ways to decorate a simple handle to make it pop from the basket; (3) weaving a cheese-style basket; and (4) enjoying a presentation on "wheat weaving" by Pam Goss.

The **NEW** procedure regarding renewal membership dues, which is now in effect, is as follows:

October 1*	membership renewal dues of \$20 to be paid, which covers calendar year October 1 through September 30	
Oct. 2 – 31	30-day grace period with no penalty added to renewal membership dues (\$20)	
Nov. 1 – 30	\$5-late fee applied to renewal membership dues (\$25)	
December 1	member dropped and must reapply for membership at the new-member rate of \$25	
* NOTE: Dues will always be accepted at anytime; you do not have to wait for October 1.		

Another change in membership policy, which is now in effect, is the elimination of *family* memberships. The bylaw now states:

Article IV Membership: Section 2:

Classes of membership shall be individual and honorary (to be determined by the Board). All members shall have the right to vote.



Special Raffle. We are very excited about our big raffle news! Patty Bagley is the resident basketry instructor at the John C. Campbell Folk Art School. She has chosen TBG as the recipient of a tuition voucher that will cover a class of the winner's choice. We will have some of the current catalogs at each meeting so that you can examine what is currently being offered. You can also research the school by going to their website at www.folkschool.org.

Patty recently wrote the following to us:

So, exactly what are we offering?

The John C. Campbell Folk School is a unique place. Classes are offered 47 weeks and 12 weekends each year. Each week or weekend, 12 - 16 classes are offered in over 40 different areas. Besides the world renown instructors and classes, students at the Folk School enjoy a week of camaraderie and community from the morning walks and morning songs to the family style meals and evening dances and demonstrations.

In the Basketry area we have some outstanding instructors: JoAnn Catsos, Martha Weatherby, Alan Litchfield, Jo Campbell Amsler, Jill Choate, Emma Jackson Garrett, Matt Tommey, Tika Tucker, Pati English and many more. I'm especially pleased that Eric Taylor will be joining us in 2012. A week long class can really give you an in depth understanding of a particular style of basket or your favorite instructor.

2011 tuition for a week long class at the Folk School ranges in price from \$488 for a slightly shorter week to \$620 for Advanced weeks. We are offering a week long tuition for the week of the winner's choice and in the area of their choice.

What's not covered are Room and Board and materials fees. Room and Board range from \$428 for a dorm arrangement (including all meals) to \$670 for Premium Guest Quarters. There are even options for camping and meal only plans if you end up staying off campus. Materials fees vary with each instructor but if the fee is over \$100 it is noted in the catalog and on the website, which has more details and lots more information at <u>www.folkschool.org</u>.

So take some time and check it out! The tickets for the John C. Campbell Folk School raffle will be \$5 each and sold separately from the regular raffle tickets.
