TBG'S NEW BASKET CHALLENGE

TBG would like to try something new to challenge our creativity. This idea came from the Cape Fear Basketmakers' article published in the February, 2010, issue of *The Reeder's Report*. Please consider participating as you read about the project. Let me begin by issuing a gentle warning. Because this is a three-month, progressive activity, you will need to commit to this project for the entire three-month period. Consequently, failing to participate all three months will create a domino effect resulting in subsequent members not being able to complete their parts of the challenge.

As Diane mentioned in her message from page 1, we will sign up for this project at the January meeting and vote on whether to use a round, square, or oval base. I will order the bases determined by the number of sign-ups and distribute them at the February meeting.

If you cannot attend the January meeting and would like to participate, contact Dawn West at 757.865.0753 by January 10.

Here's how the project works:


Before the March meeting, insert spokes into the base that you received at the February meeting and secure the spokes with twining. You may use weaving materials of any size and any color of your choosing.

Month #1 – March. Bring the partially-created basket in a brown paper bag to the March meeting. The brown paper bag will prevent mildew and keep the basket from being seen. Each participant is assigned a number, and your bag is numbered accordingly by someone not participating. Then each participant draws a

number for the bag they will take home. The non-participating member records who has what bag.

Before the April meeting, get those creative juices flowing by weaving the sides of your basket in any style and any color that you want. Stop short of the rim row.

Month #2 – April. Bring the almost-completed basket to the April meeting in the same brown paper bag in which you brought it home.



The bags are not opened before you draw another number. Again, the newly drawn number is recorded by the non-participating member, who, in turn, records which bag you will take home this time.

Before the May meeting, rim the basket, add a handle (or handles) if you wish, and complete any finishing touches or embellishments you want to include.

Month #3 – May – The Unveiling! Once again, place the now-completed basket in the brown paper bag and bring the finished masterpiece to the May meeting.

One by one, the record keeper announces each participant's number. As members claim their original bags, they reveal their new baskets! Just imagine how exciting it will be to watch as each newly-created basket emerges looking so different and unique from its March beginnings. After all of the baskets have been unveiled, members sign the baskets on which they worked.

I hope you give this challenge a try!
