UFO Program - Jamie explained our UFO program for the new members. We will begin a new round starting at our March meeting with #1 due then. If you did not bring your list you can e-mail it to Alice Wyvill, who is in charge of the program.

GW 09 Update – Laura White – This was our largest GW yet with 172 attending and 21 teachers. We received 122 evaluations of which most were very favorable. Laura thanked all of the volunteers and also Tina Chopin who made her a beautiful miniature basket from ash and copper as a thank you for serving as GW Chair.

Feb 21st Clarity (basket over vase), \$15.00, taught by Alice Wyvill. There are still a few openings. Class will start at 9am here at the church.

March 1st Susie Waters will teach the Happy Pockets basket, using the yo-yos we were taught in Jan by Carol Vanderzee, at the end of the meeting. It is free and there are still a few spots left.

April 4th Gathering of the Guilds will be held in VA Bch at the Francis Land House. It is a nice small gathering inside, from 10am – 4pm. Kim Voska volunteered to chair, Carol Vanderzee, Rose Glenn, and Tina Chopin also volunteered to help.

April 24 – 26th is the VA Bch Craft Fair. Ella Mae King will chair and coordinate additional help to work the fair and help set up our display.

Jamie asked Carol Vanderzee to tell us about The Gathering of the Guilds which was held yesterday. Carol, who was speaking for her daughter, Kim, who chaired the event, said that it was a very nice event. There was a lot of interest in our open to the public class, which will be held May 16th. She wanted to extend her thanks to those who volunteered with her and Kim: Rose Glen, Doreen Smith, Glen Bowie, and Dawn West.

Diane Short - Classes and Sign ups -

Tina Chopin's class for the double wall twilled basket will be held again on May 30th for a cost of \$15.00.

Pattie English will be here June 26 – 28 and her classes will be held at Coventry Club House in Yorktown. She will be teaching 3 classes a day: a beginner, an intermediate, and an advanced. Pictures and information will be up on the website soon. The 8 hour classes will start at 9:00 AM and the 6 hour classes will start at 10:00 AM. Please bring food to share for lunch.

Something you would like us to know? I am a children's librarian in Chesapeake where I love working with "my" kids.



Guilders Weave 2009 is all over except the memories and the statistics.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for the wonderful job you did on Guilders Weave 09. The GW Committee was outstanding but they could never do the job without the support of all our members and our teachers. The volunteers, the donations to the raffle and the welcome bags and the overall GW support just gets better and better each year. This is confirmed by the 122 event evaluations we received.

Wrap-up of the evaluations:

- Accommodations are considered Excellent to Good by 99% of our people.
- Hotel staff is considered Responsive by 99% of our people.
- 96% were satisfied with the class choices.
- 87% thought the teacher choices were Excellent, while 13% thought choices were Good.
- Water access sufficient 100%; Space sufficient 89% and Lighting sufficient 92%
- 97% find Welcome Bags useful and 99% want to continue the welcome bags
- 83% visited the hospitality suite
- 99% thought website and email communications were excellent or good
- 93% weave the basket kit; 7% share the kit or give it away.

Frequently voiced comments:

"Loved the hospitality suite."

"The side cutters and leather holders are great."

"Want sweatshirts and denim shirts for memorabilia."

"I didn't win a raffle prize."

"I like the teacher nametags."

"It was great. Don't change a thing."

Pet Peeves heard from some of our weavers:

- Coming to class late with poor excuses. Example given-"I'm not a morning person".
- Leaving class early with a poor excuse. Example given-"The ball game is on".
- Using cell phones in class.
- Inviting visitors to class. Chatter disrupted the students' concentration.

Most Favorite Thing s about GW---Great classes, meeting people, great teachers.

Being surrounded by so many wonderful weavers-It really invigorates my weaving. Getting together with friends.
