Tidewater Basketry Guild General Meeting January 7, 2007

Meeting called to order by President Jamie VanOekel. She thanked Billie Dorris for hosting the annual Christmas party in December.

Sherral Nelson showed variations of the basket class she will be teaching on February 17th. The basket can have a swing handle, bushel handles or feet for chair side use. The cost is \$50 and is due today.

Billie Dorris showed a basket she received for Christmas from her daughter-in-law. It was purchased in Keoto Japan. It's purpose is to catch fish and is shaped so that the fish can not turn around and escape.

Billie also asked for helpers to cover the tables at NCBA. She will be doing this on Wednesday at 8:00 p.m. Please give her a hand if you are there Wednesday evening.

Tina Chopin reported that all is going well for Guilders Weave 2007.

Liz Pangrac is taking over the task of the hospitality room at GW '07. She was happy to receive great information from Dick and Carol Moff about previous years. Liz asked members to bring additional coolers and reminded everyone that food donations are needed to keep the room stocked at all times during the event. She also requested that TBG members help her by keeping the room tidied up when they notice the need.

Diane Short has confirmed upcoming classes with visiting teachers. Mr. Jim and Miss Jimmy Kent will be here on July 13, 14 and 15. They will bring definite proposals to GW '07. Tentatively they plan for Mr. Jim to teach an advanced class starting on the 13th and finishing on the 14th. He will teach a beginner class on the 15th. Miss Jimmy will teach a class on the 14th. Diane arranged for Gail Hutchinson to teach on August 17, 18 and 19. Gail will also bring her proposed baskets to GW '07. At this time Diane is looking for a place to hold these classes. She says that by April she should have more information regarding costs and basket pictures.

Alice Wyvill had members show their UFO baskets. She explained again that each person who finishes a UFO will have their name put into a drawing for a grand prize. If all six baskets are completed, that person's name will be in six times, five baskets completed will have five names in, etc. The more baskets completed, the better your chances are to win. There is a monthly drawing also and this month's winner was Suzie Waters. February 4^{th's} UFO is number two.

Gathering of the Guilds will be March 31st this year. Peggy Williams is chairing this event and she needs a few volunteers to bring their baskets and spend the day weaving on a project of their choice. This will be from 10:00 to 4:00.

The Courthouse Galleries of Portsmouth (on High Street) will present: *By Native Hands, Native American Baskets,* from the Lauren Rogers Museum of Art from March 2 to May 13, 2007. They have requested that TBG provide a basket weaving demonstration on March 11th from 1:00 to 5:00. Volunteers are needed for this time. Please notify Jamie VanOekel if you are interested. This will be a great opportunity to talk about our guild, pass out membership brochures and get interested people to sign up for the upcoming OTP's.

The Gallery also has a need for an individual to demonstrate weaving on May 12 and 13 from 12:00 to 3:00. This is not a guild function but an individual artisan to show their special talent. Please call or email Jamie if you would be interested in this opportunity.

The fun part of today's general meeting was stuffing the "welcome bags" for GW '07. The committee did a wonderful job of gathering useful items for all attendees.
