Guilders Weave 2007

It is almost time to send in your registration forms for GW07!! Do you wonder what happens to the applications between the time you mail them and you get your class assignments? This is how it works. The committee checks the postmark date on the front of your envelope. All the applications marked Sept. 1st (and only Sept. 1st) go in a basket and then someone draws them out one at a time and we assign classes as we draw envelopes. After all the Sept. 1st envelopes have been processed we move on to Sept. 2nd, then the 3rd, etc. until all the applications have been opened and classes assigned. Once a class fills up we start putting students in their number two choice. So you can see how important it is to get that application to the post office on SEPTEMBER 1!!!! When all the students have been assigned to classes we usually have a class or two that didn't make the minimum number. We contact those teachers and ask if they would be willing to teach a smaller number of students. If they agree then we leave that class open. If the class has to be cancelled we go back and reassign those students to their next choice. On occasion there will be a student who doesn't get into any classes on one day usually because they only listed one or two classes and those filled up before their application was drawn or their class was cancelled. (So give us plenty of choices!) Finally, we mail a letter to each student listing the classes to which they have been assigned. So....mail those applications on **SEPTEMBER 1**, give us plenty of choices, and keep your fingers crossed!
