This helps you identify which are which more easily.~~~Thank you Basket's N The Works *************** Use cable ties to help keep your bundles of reed together. As the bundle gets smaller, you can pull the cable tie tighter. Thank you Lisa Kemp~~Basket's N The Works Use pony tail holders (the kind with two balls) to secure the end of a coil of reed. This really works! Place it on the end of the coil right after opening it. This works better then rubber bands. Thank you Diana Dorsey~~Basket's N The Works


