Store your reed in an unused Pizza delivery box. This works great, your reed is stored flat in the box on a shelf. Write on the outside end the type of reed and in an instant you can see what you have.

Remember how hard it is to re-coil an open pound of reed, here is an easy, inexpensive way to keep your reed banded together. Use little girls' hair ties (pony tail holders) to wrap around the coil of reed. The holders with the balls on each end work great! And they are re-useable.

Having trouble tucking reed when finishing your basket? Here is an easy way to use an everyday Milk carton. Wash out your used plastic milk carton. Cut strips (width of the reed) from the flat sides. Fold strip in half, insert behind the reed, (where you want your reed tucked) put your reed between the pieces of folded milk carton, grab bottom of milk carton end with the reed inside and pull. This will allow the reed to smoothly pull through the spot you are working on.

Use a Quilting pattern board for quick easy measuring when laying out a base, cutting reed or anytime you need a quick measurement. Can be found anywhere quilting/sewing materials are sold.



Meeting brought to order by our new President Jamie VanOekel. All other board members introduced themselves and told the office they hold. New members and visitors were welcomed. Charlene Cohoon was visiting. Carol Woolard, Chris Irby and Kirsten Dickason have joined the guild.

Kim Voska showed the 2006 Volunteer calendar and asked for volunteers to sign up for various openings.

Members were advised that the Susan Reed-Fanfoni class for Saturday, November 19<sup>th</sup> is full. For those attending, it will be held at the Simonsdale Civic Center and will begin at 9:00 a.m.

Cass Schorsh will be coming from Michigan in May for three days to teach three baskets. A sign up sheet is out for those members who <u>are going</u> to take the classes. Laura White will be collecting the class fees in January. These classes will be open to other guilds if TBG does not fill all the spaces.

Ann Bowers is willing to come teach in July but only if enough people are interested in pursuing this event. A sign up sheet with photos of the baskets is out for members wanting to learn her interesting patterns.

Jerry Bernstein gave his report on the Newport News Fall Festival. He said the TBG booth won \$200 for best display. Each person volunteering in the booth wove a section of a beautiful double wall, multicolored basket. Tammy Durant won the drawing for this wonderful prize.

Alice Wyvill reported the Williamsburg Festival of Arts was a success. The weather was good and there was a large turnout. There were people interested in attending an OTP but were reluctant to due the distance to Norfolk. She suggested that we think about having the fall OTP in Newport News/Williamsburg and the spring OTP in Norfolk.

Kim Voska was pleased with the four students who came to the October OTP. She thanked teachers Alice Wyvill, Ella Mae King, and Peggy Williams. While others were weaving, Diane Short verified the contents of the extra kits and made them ready for the next class. Kim mentioned her appreciation for TBG members who stopped by and visited during the class.

Cathy Gray discussed the Chesapeake Heritage Arts Festival. She had four people volunteering for the booth. She liked the idea of the volunteer drawing basket and might try to incorporate for next year. Many baskets were entered in the judging and Judith Saunders won best of show with her copper bias weave basket.
