

ITS THAT TIME AGAIN! The board will be appointing a nominating committee to accept nominations for new Guild officers. The slate of candidates will be presented at the August Pool Party. We will be voting at the September meeting for Vice President and Treasurer to take office the first of October.

Barbara Jessome has most efficiently served two terms as Treasurer and per our By Laws, cannot run for an additional term. I have threatened Linda Lindner with all sorts of dire actions and still have not gotten her to agree to another term as our Vice President. Perhaps the nominating committee will be more successful. Linda and Barbara have devoted a great deal of time and effort to supporting our Guild and have both done an excellent job. Linda stepped into the void two years ago when we were unable to find anyone to take the job as Vice President. She hesitated to take on the job, at that time, as she was a relatively new weaver and did not have years and years of Guild experience. She has proven that you don't need to have twenty years of weaving/Guild experience and be OLD to effectively fill a board position. I want to encourage you all to start thinking about how you personally can support the Guild. Consider running for office or volunteering as a Committee Chair. Jamie and I will be vacating the Secretary and President positions NEXT year. It is not too early to be thinking about replacements for us.

Start thinking about members you would like to see on the September ballot for Vice President and Treasurer. Review the responsibilities of the positions as described in the By Laws. Do not submit a name until you have asked that person if they will accept if elected. You must have their approval before putting their name on the ballot. Please plan to be at both the pool party and the September meeting to participate in these two important activities. We will be announcing the names of the nominating committee members and posting the candidates' names, write ups and ballots on the website. Nominations will be taken from the floor at the September meeting, provided the nominee has given prior consent.
