It has been a busy summer for all of us.

I want to take this opportunity to say thanks to you all for the fantastic support you have given to me and the board this year. Our volunteers have been wonderful and so enthusiastic. I want to especially thank Meredith for her outstanding support and generous devotion to the guild and guild members. Even with the arrival of Angie's new baby, she still managed to be here for us all. Congratulations and we love you.

Once again a big thanks to Billie for hosting a great August pool party. I didn't get a count but I think it was the largest party in our short history. A wonderful time was had by all.

A few words of praise to our webmaster for the outstanding job she did establishing our website. I get a thrill every time I direct a new person to our site. Our thanks to all our wonderful teachers: Alice for the trivet and the napkin basket, Carol for the porcupine, and all those who gave their time and talents to OTP. Our thanks to Rhonda, our Special Events Coordinator, for her efforts in ensuring that the OTP was a rewarding experience for all our new weavers. I know I am leaving people out because every time I looked around someone was making a noteworthy contribution- Linda as our Sales Coordinator, Jennifer as Membership, Jerry with his great scissor pouches and his assistance with Billie at the VB Craftmarket. I give up, but I know I have left out many people. Please forgive me, there is simply not enough time or words to let you know how much I appreciate the talents and generosity of our guild members.

We have had a most successful weaving year. Not counting OTP and Technique baskets, we have taught 7 basket classes since January of this year, six guild teachers and one outside teacher- trivet, napkin, porcupine, knotless, small tote, flared flower and Anne Bower's cathead. Wow!

**Try to attend the September 8<sup>th</sup> meeting.** We will be holding elections for Treasurer and Vice President. We have a great slate of nominations ready for your vote, the last page of the newsletter shows the nominees. Read their bio's and vote on Sept. 8th.

We have 4 teachers and 24 people signed up for the Fall Harvest Basket. This basket will teach our newer weavers several new techniques. They will learn to insert spokes into a wooden slotted base. The spokes will be secured with two rows of twining. The sides will be woven in a continuous weave as the basket will have an UNEVEN number of stakes, making note that EVEN STAKES means START AND STOP, UNEVEN STAKES means CONTINUOUS WEAVING. We are planning to complete this basket during this meeting but will rim the basket at the end of the November Meeting if our business meeting should take too much time.

The September 21<sup>st</sup> class was cancelled due to lack of interest. We will have Open Weave that day at the church if we have enough interest. We are tentatively planning to work on the Technique Sampler and ANY other basket you may want to bring in. We will have a registration form for this at the meeting on the 8th. We will need ten or more interested members in order to hold the open weave.

We need volunteers to man the Newport News Fall Festival on 5-6 October and to teach the October OTP on 26 October. Call Rhonda and let her know when you are available.

We have been very busy and we have tentatively scheduled a lot of activities for the upcoming year. We need all our people to volunteer their talents. Talk to Alice, our Volunteer Coordinator, and get your name on the calendar for this years activities. See you on the 8th .

## MORE Volunteers Needed for TBG Volunteer Program

The Board announced a new TBG Volunteer Program planned for next year to encourage more active participation and better skill utilization of our new members. We have been so very fortunate with our latest volunteers, Cindy for newsletter/website, Rhonda for Special Events, Jennifer for Membership and Linda for Sales that we felt we should explore our membership to see what other skills are being hidden away.

A team of two volunteers would be assigned for each month to assist the board in all activities planned for that month. The "Coordinators" would **assist** the Vice President and Special Events Coordinator in:

- preparing any materials for the meeting
- order supplies when needed and assemble kits
- would set up the meeting space
- handle signups for classes and collect moneys
- clean up and close down
- provide Volunteer Coordinator with an after action report giving attendees, expenses, income, names of volunteers and pertinent comments

On months with special events planned such as OTPs, CraftMarket, Dye Workshop, and Fall Festival the Coordinators would work with Rhonda, Meredith and the event chairperson to determine what needed to be done and work accordingly. Coordinators will recruit additional helpers when needed.

The 2003 Guild Calendar maintained on the web page will list team coordinators for each month. The Board will appoint a Volunteer Coordinator to maintain the action reports and volunteer names. Each time a guild member's name shows up on an after action report, that name goes into a basket for a drawing in September. The grand prize winner will have their membership dues paid for the upcoming year and registration fees for Guilders Weave paid. There will also be second and third prize winner receiving one year of membership dues paid.
