Please help me in **Welcoming Jennifer Gramza** as our new Membership Chairperson. Jennifer joined us in Nov. 2001, and we would like to thank Jennifer for all her help. Many of you have tasted the wonderful Lemon Bars that **Rhonda Jones** has made in the past, well here is the recipe that many have asked for.. But Rhonda that doesn't mean you can stop making them!!!

#### **Rhonda Jones' Wonderful Rich Lemon Bars**

1 1/2 cups plus 3 tablespoons unsifted flour
1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
3/4 cup cold butter
4 eggs, slightly beaten
1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 cup lemon juice
additional confectioners' sugar

Preheat oven to 350. In medium bowl, combine 1 1/2 cups flour and 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar; cut in butter until crumbly. Press onto bottom of lightly greased 13 X 9-inch baking pan; bake 15 minutes. Meanwhile, in large bowl combine eggs, granulated sugar, baking powder, lemon juice and remaining 3 tablespoons of flour. Pour over baked crust; bake 20 to 25 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool. Cut into bars. Sprinkle with additional confectioners' sugar. Stove covered in refrigerator.

**Strength:** Comes from the size and strength of the material used, the tightness of the weave, the type of weave used, and the distance between the weave and the spokes.

**Quality:** Comes from repetition and care with your craftsmanship.

**Design:**Comes from stopping and looking often at your work.

#### **Gathering of the Guilds**

March 23rd marked the **11th annual Gathering of the Guilds** at the historic Francis Land House in Virginia Beach and our 8th year of participation in this event. (The earliest photos in our photo albums were taken at this event in 1995 - our first "public" appearance!)

The House was open without charge for this gathering, and the staff estimated that over 300 people attended this year to observe artisans from 14 guilds demonstrating their skills and displaying their handiwork. Beekeepers, blacksmiths, quilters, spinners, knitters, weavers, lace makers, carvers, smockers, needlepointers, seamstresses, folk musicians, gardeners and basketweavers were spread out through the house and grounds. Our own Lucy Fowler, who is now an employee of the House, was on hand in period costume with her spinning wheel. We talked to a lot of people, handed out a lot of applications for our OTP class, admired other crafters' work, and had a great time just being together.

The April 4th edition of the **Virginian Pilot's, Beacon** included a nice write-up on the Gathering and mentioned our guild. I even got a phone call from a lady who wanted to learn to weave and called the House to get a point of contact for us!

I had the pleasure of coordinating our participation in this year's event. Many thanks to all the volunteers who assisted with their presence or materials for the display - Dick Baylor, Billie Dorris, Debbie Henderson, Rhonda Jones, Meredith Macdonald, Cindy Stanton and her daughter Amanda, Laura White, and Alice Wyvill.
