We began weaving on a project we brought from home and invited the children to either make a Christmas tree ornament or take one that we had made. Proposed Updates to the Guild Bylaws (to be discussed at the January meeting)

The board proposed the following changes to the Tidewater Basketry Bylaws

Disestablish the library and remove the Tidewater Lending Library Guidelines from the Bylaws. Remove the Librarian (Member at Large) position description from the Board Member Position Descriptions. Change Article IV. Board and Officers to read three Members at Large vice four Members at Large.

Add to Non-Board Positions the positions of Special Events Coordinator and Guilders Weave Coordinator. The Special Event Coordinator, appointed by the Vice President will serve as the Coordinator for the Open to the Public classes and will assist the Vice President with coordination of other events as assigned. The Guilders Weave Coordinator shall be appointed by the President and shall coordinate all Guilders Weave committee activities.
