## November 7 - Pine Needle Ornament by Jane Tolar

If you admired the creations you saw on Facebook in the Ornament swap, you will want to sign up for Jane Tolar's Pine Needle Ornament class on November 7. You will create your own unique pine needle ornament on a birch slice. This project is perfect for all skill levels, including beginners. The kit is \$10.00, and you can order an extra kit when you sign up, if you want to create a second ornament. You will select thread and bead colors and a holiday decal (some ideas attached) or request a plain slice to decorate on your own after class. Bring scissors and small needle nose pliers.

By purchasing a plain slice, you may decorate on your own after class. \$10 for each additional kit. Jane has prepared the birch slices by gluing sisal twine for coiling the pine needles.
