The Arts Center of Cannon County, TN.

In June, Christy Newman and I had the privilege of visiting the White Oak Basket and Chair history exhibit at the Art Center of Cannon County

(www.artscenterofcc.com) in Woodbury, TN. What a very nice exhibit. Our tour guide was White Oak basket maker Sue Williams, who's baskets are in this display. She shared her knowledge of White Oak baskets and the history with us. In 2019 Sue won the *Tennessee Folklife Heritage Award, Folk & Traditional Arts Master Artist Fellowship* and is considered a Tennessee Treasure. In this area of Tennessee, basket makers produced white oak baskets back as far as the Civil War. In 1985 Sue took her first basket class from Estel and Gertie Youngblood. Gertie said Sue had basket making "in her blood". Sue quickly mastered the White Oak basket. She then began advocating for basketmaking and its tradition, teaching group classes and apprentices. Thank you Sue and the Arts Center of Cannon County for a great exhibit and offering up your time to talk to us about what we love- baskets. — Cindy Stanton
