Guilders Weave 2025

It's Weaving Time Somewhere ... 15 days but who's counting!!!!

Since we only have a few days until ZERO HOUR, I thought I would send out some helpful information. It is a lot, so hold onto your hat, hopefully a tie-dyed hat

Check-in: Extra hotel staff will be working to ensure rooms are ready. However, if you are an early arrival, the hotel staff will hold your luggage in a precheck-in area behind the registration desk. You will be provided a "luggage hold" ticket as you wait for your room to be available.

Requesting special arrangements at check-in (such as being on the same level as another set of friends) will cause additional waiting time for your room. So please be prepared to wait longer for room availability.

Room Keys: For your safety and the safety of all guests, your room keys will allow you to enter the elevator and stop at your floor only. You will need to coordinate with other friends staying on different floors to visit each other.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS INCLUDE:

- Beautiful, quality accommodations, completely NO SMOKING!
- For those Attendees STAYING AT THE MARRIOTT.... FREE breakfast included with each room guest (up to four per room)
- Complementary self-parking inside the parking garage that is connected to the hotel. This garage is city owned and operated. Hotel is not responsible for any loss or damage. Make sure you DISPLAY your Hotel Tag on your rearview mirror.
- Complimentary Wi-Fi in all guest rooms and meeting rooms.
- Chiller refrigerators in each room

Event Registration: Registration opens at 3:00 pm on Thursday, January 16th in the lobby by the weaving rooms. Times are 3:00 – 7:00 pm and Friday morning 7:00 – 7:45am.

- You must always wear a student name tag in the event areas during the weekend.
- If you are a first-time student this year, you will be given a free neck wallet at registration.
- If you have lost or misplaced your neck wallet, replacements will be available for purchase.
- On arrival, please check in at our Guilders' Weave registration table to pick up your welcome bag and name tag.

Memorabilia: Memorabilia will be available for pick up during registration. Same area...

Hotel Restaurant: The hotel restaurant will have extended lunch hours on Thursday to accommodate our registration and class schedules. Additionally, the restaurant is offering a GW Special Dinner on Thursday and Friday nights. Look for the particulars displayed in the restaurant area.

Breakfasts 6:30 – 8:00 am: Friday morning, Saturday morning, and Sunday morning breakfast is served in the Rotunda for guests staying in the Marriott. This is included with your GW attendee negotiated room rates.

The Country Seat is our sole vendor – vending from Thursday through Sunday morning! The Country Seat will also take special and large orders ahead of time... save on shipping! If there are any specific items you would like to see or purchase or if you would like to place an order for her to bring along, please send/call/email your requests to her by Monday, January 6th. If you would like to prepay the order in the online catalog – www.countryseat.com – please choose the free Store Pickup as your shipping option and put "GW Pick Up" in the Delivery Notes during checkout. Contact them in advance for large orders that you may need, and they will do their best to support your requests.

First Time Attendee Orientation/Tour: Meet Rose Glen in the Rotunda at 4:45 pm! We have 24 First-Time Attendees, and you will get a chance to hear first-hand about where to go, what to look for and a few highlights of the event.

Hospitality Room: The hospitality room is located just past the vendor room. Stop in and enjoy some of the snacks donated by our fellow weavers. If you would like to provide something for the hospitality room, please consider apples, bananas, oranges, snack size bags of chips, granola bars, trail mix, cakes, cookies, candy and, CHOCOLATE! All items must be individually pre-packaged. We welcome home baked items, but please package these in individual zip-lock snack bags. Bottled water will be available.

Pre-Order Kits: Pre-ordered kits will be available for pick up Friday prior to Teacher Marketplace, approximately 5:30 pm at the Registration Desk. There's a lot of loot to haul... so be prepared!

Teacher Marketplace: Friday evening from 7:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. Teachers and registered participants will be selling items you may not have yet seen. Participants will be setting up their wares at their assigned tables in BOTH class areas. Be sure to check it out... lots to see, lots to buy ...who knows what you will find!

Bingo: Friday night approximately 8:30 p.m., after Teacher Marketplace. Join us immediately following marketplace in the dining room for an hour of fun. Cash Bar will be available.

Raffle Tables: Saturday evening drawings!! Special thanks to Christy Newman, Carol Ann Blair, and company for running our wonderful raffle! Please consider donating a basket-related item (or two) for the raffle! Bring your cash or checks! The more tickets you purchase, the more chances to win!!

Do not forget your address labels for the raffle tickets...labels make it much easier to put your name on the ticket... especially for those of us purchasing "mass quantities"!!

Basket Swap Event: Saturday evening, after the raffle drawings are awarded. The basket swap is a wonderful community exchange for weavers to give and receive a hand-woven basket with another weaver. Everyone is encouraged to participate regardless of their weaving skill level!! Take your basket to the Basket Swap table and fill out a tag and tie it on your basket. This is always a fun and rewarding activity. We hope you will participate!

Masseuse: Carol Ivey is back again! She will be offering sign-ups for chair/table massages in the coatroom (across from registration)

Knife Sharpener: Saturday ONLY.....Thanks to Tina for obtaining a new knife/scissor sharpener. Items will be sharpened the same day. To have your item(s) sharpened, put your name and cell number on a piece of paper, place the paper and your items in a self-provided large Ziploc bag. You will receive them back in the same bag.

Classes: Classes begin PROMPTLY!

- Friday at 8:00 am
- Saturday at 8:00 am
- Sunday at 8:00 am
- NO FOOD OR DRINKS, except water, is allowed in the classrooms!!
- NO CELL PHONES may be used during class time. Please respect the teachers and fellow weavers. Be sure to turn off or silence your cell phone before the start of classes. If you must use your phone, please leave the classroom.
- Teachers do NOT sell items during class. Selling in class disrupts the lesson and takes the attention away from the students. Please be respectful of your fellow weavers. If you are interested in something, please attend teacher marketplace.
