- That a positive, caring environment fosters the wellbeing of youth.



Our goal is to help prepare each youth for a successful return to the care of parents or guardians or, alternatively, to prepare them for more independent living.

SIGN operates a co-ed community-based group home licensed for up to five adolescents ages 12 to 15.

Youth are referred through the Ministry of Social Services.

The group home provides a caring residential environment to assist the development and growth of youth.

It operates under the mandate of Saskatchewan's Child and Family Services Act.




The adolescent group home provides a caring, nurturing home, supervised 24 hours a day, where the process of developing healthy relationships is recognized as important to the development of youth.

The ability to learn life skills, deal with personal issues and take responsibility for themselves is paramount to the provision of support to young people. They are encouraged to see each experience as an opportunity to grow and develop.

Youth are required to attend school in Yorkton or be involved in a supervised work experience.

They may also be active with various support services, clubs, or recreational activities in the community.
