What we do

- We receive referrals from Ministry of Social Service (MSS);
- Trained Family Preservation Workers (FPWs) are matched to each family;
- FPWs work flexible hours to accommodate family schedules;
- Communication is ethically documented and reported;
- The family, MSS caseworker, and FPW set mutual goals;
- Safety plans are completed for both physical and emotional safety;
- Services are implemented tailored to family strengths;
- FPWs assess and provide programming based on the values and needs of the family;
- FPWs can provide supervised visits as directed by MSS;
- Various approaches are adapted to the family's learning style;
- Skill development programming is facilitated;
- Collaboration with agencies such as Education, Health and Justice takes place as needed;
- We provide advocacy on behalf of the family;
- Transition to appropriate services takes place when Family Preservation services end.

We provide a response to family crisis situations to ensure the safety of the children, while allowing them to remain in the home.

Our families have these rights:

- To receive the best service we can provide;
- To inform a supervisor if unhappy with the service;
- To know we work as a team with you, with each other, and with other professionals;
- To decide on goals for improvement and understand the risks and benefits of each option;
- To request to see their information;
- To say No, Yes, Pass, Goodbye, or I don't know;
- To decide what information you share, and have their information kept confidential.

Please note that limits of confidentiality include court orders and/or a duty to report if there is threat or harm.



Family Preservation is an intensive in-home support program. We provide support and services to vulnerable and at-risk families through flexible in-home visitation.

Our Family Preservation Workers collaborate with other community agencies where suitable, and make referrals where others can assist the family. We also will advocate on behalf of the family where necessary.

All we do for and with families is intended to assist the family to develop the skills necessary to keep children safe and preserve the family.





Child care respite
