  At the April 22 meeting, the SRSC Board approved proceeding with the following two data and monitoring projects with updated estimates which are planned to occur this summer/fall:
  - Shasta Temperature Control Device profiling (\$15,000)
  - Redd temperature and DO monitoring (100,000)

As part of the discussion, the SRSC Board delayed funding the genetic parentage study (100,000) since that will likely be a 2022 activity, and requested that funding alternatives be brought back to the SRSC Board for consideration for the above two items. The two alternatives for consideration are:

- 1. Add the additional costs to the SRSC budget and make an additional call for funds, approximately 25% more than the June call for funding.
- 2. Request that SRSCs selling water contribute approximately \$1.00 to \$1.50 per acre foot from their respective transfers. Please see worksheet in the packet.
