



Say "ow" (as in "show").


Say it quiet, say it loud and say it silly! Trace the letters with your finger... Let's go!

The extraordinary looking narwal has a long, spiral-shaped tusk which can be as long as a person!




I own a long tusk.

The bowhead whale uses its large, blunt head to break holes in the ice so it can breathe.




I lift up a window in the snow.

I will grow to be the biggest.




I rest in the shallows.

Bottlenose dophins are very playful and love to jump high out of the water.




I will show you I can jump!

Boto are river dolphins that live in the murky waters of the Amazon.




I follow the flow.


