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BEFORE YOU START...

The child reads the big, bold type. This contains the most common words, words that can be decoded or words containing the sound being learnt.



— The text in the corner is just for the adult or reading partner. This is to develop the child's vocabulary and promote discussion.

Whilst fur seals are incredible swimmers, they haul out on beaches to rest and to raise their young.




My fur gets wet in the surf.

Mother fur seals show great care for their pups, feeding them milk and protecting them from harm.




We curl up on the sand.




Do not disturb this burly bull!

Manta rays glide through the waters filtering out tiny prey with their gills.




A manta turns in a big curve.

I lurk in the murk.


Tiger sharks hunt for green turtles. Using its protective shell, the reptile can escape unhurt.






