Snails, Slugs and Bugs






"ai" as in snail

The snail likes it in the rain.


Some snails, like these pond snails, live all their lives in water. Can you see how their shells look different?

This slug laid a long trail.




I will wait and wait in my web.

Earthworms are so important in helping the soil stay healthy. They are also food for many other animals.




Mud contains lots of these!

Ladybirds have bright colours to warn predators that they taste horrid.




You can not fail to spot me!


The caterpillar is camouflaged now, but it will change into to a bright, beautiful butterfly.



I look plain, but just wait!




The wings look like spots of paint.
