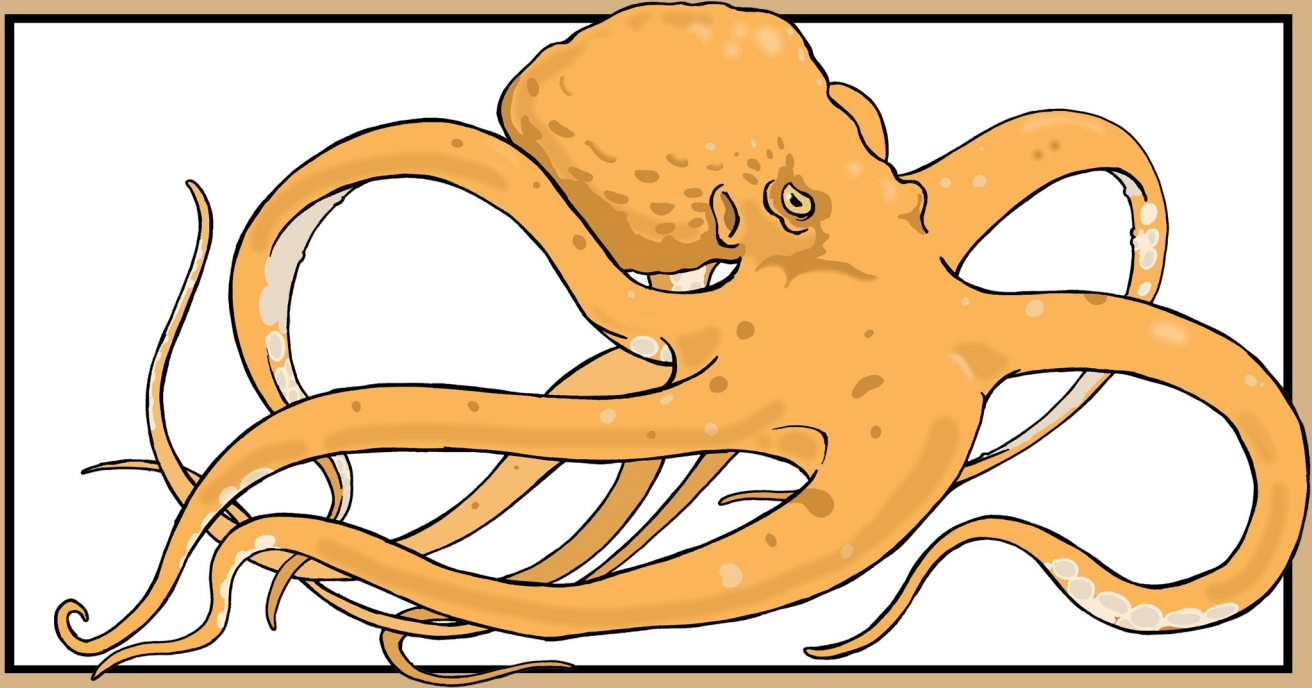

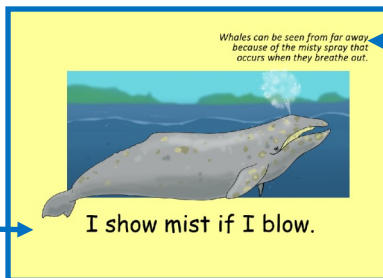

The child reads the big, bold type. This contains the most common words, words that can be decoded or words containing the sound being learnt.



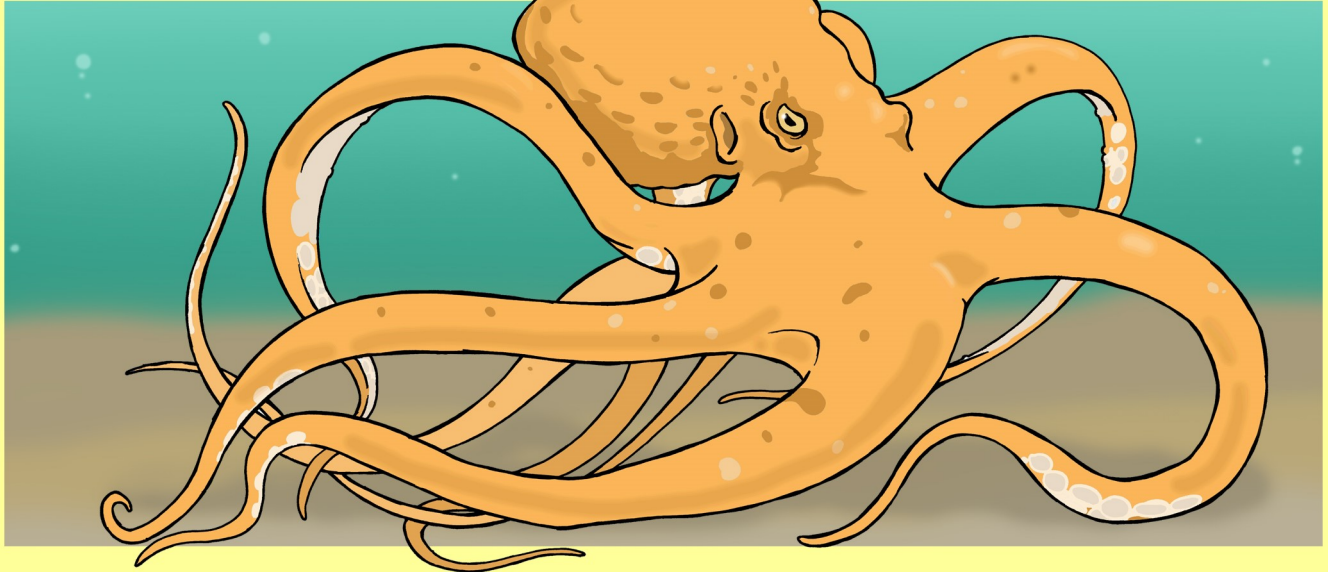
The text in the corner is just for the adult or reading partner. This is to develop the child's vocabulary and promote discussion.

Say "ay" (as in "bay").

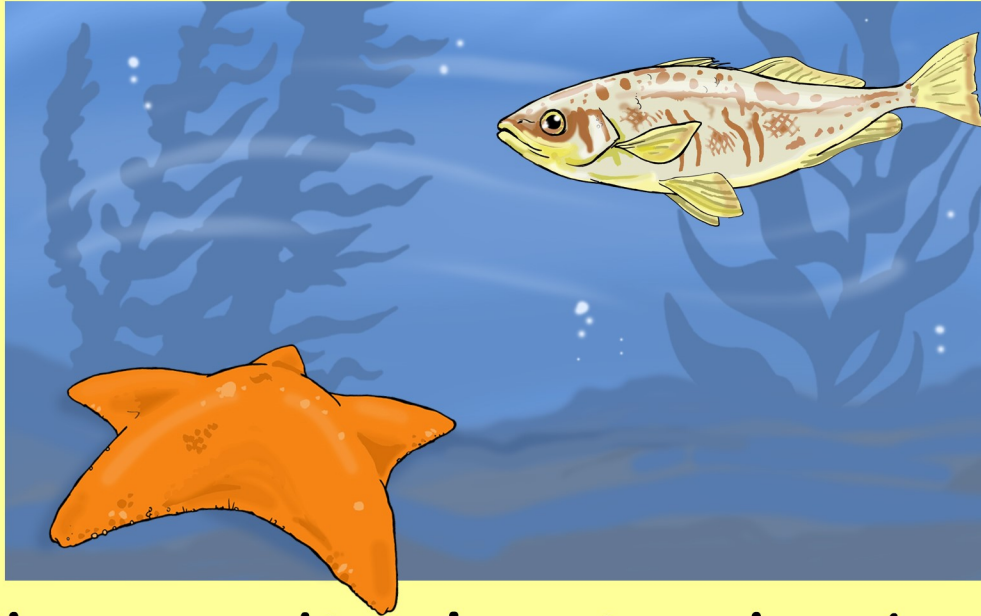
Say it **quiet**, say it **loud** and say it **silly**! Trace the letters with your finger... **Let's go!**

beautiful sea stars.*



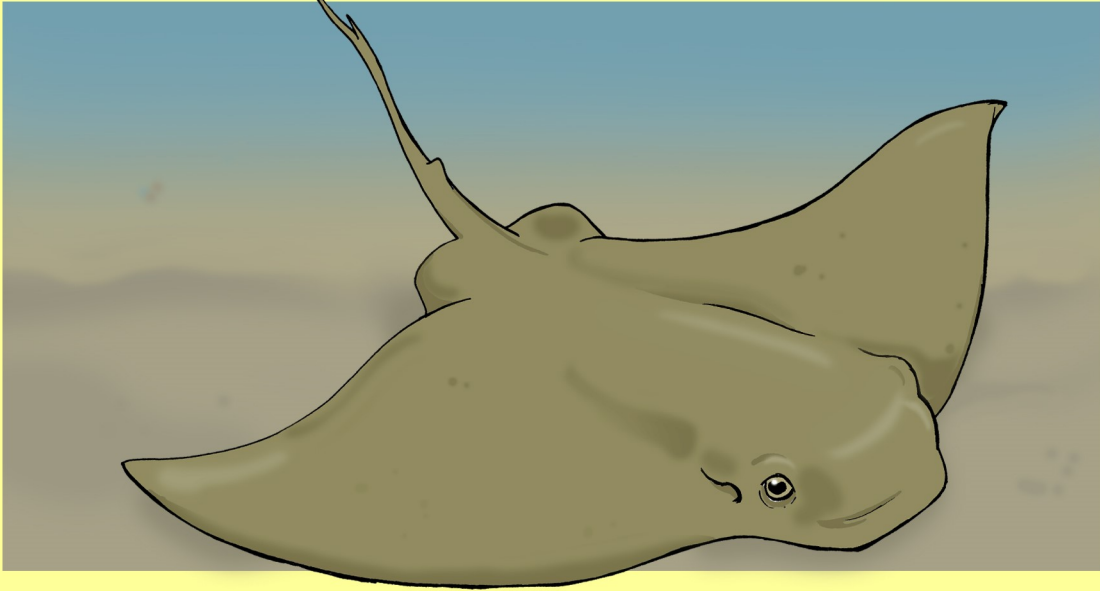
What a display in the bay!

Bat rays investigate the floor of the bay to find shellfish, like clams, which they then crush with their strong teeth.



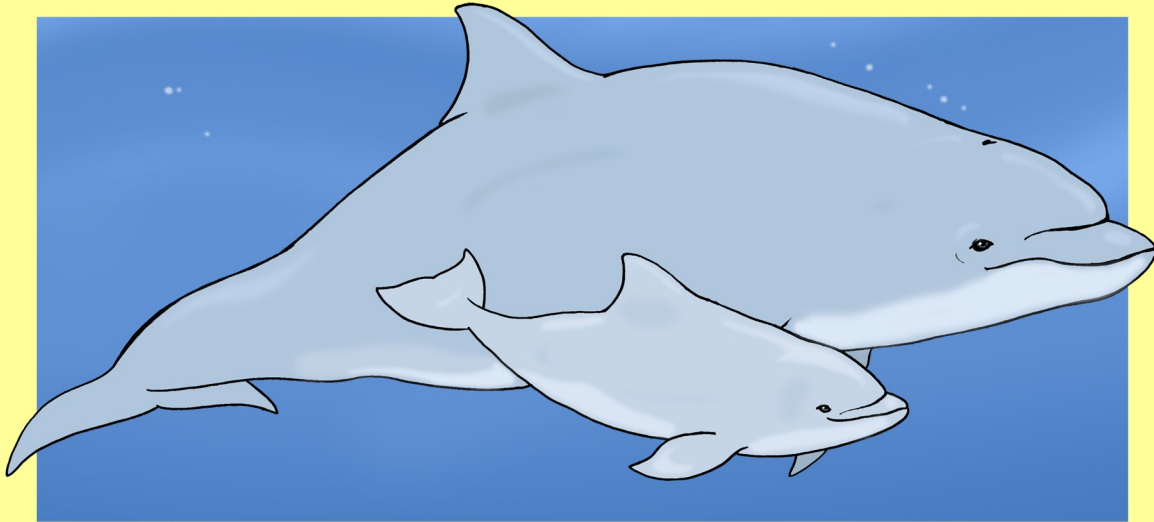
A bat ray lay on the sand.

Great white sharks hunt for elephant seal pups. The pups are small, but they are agile, fast swimmers.



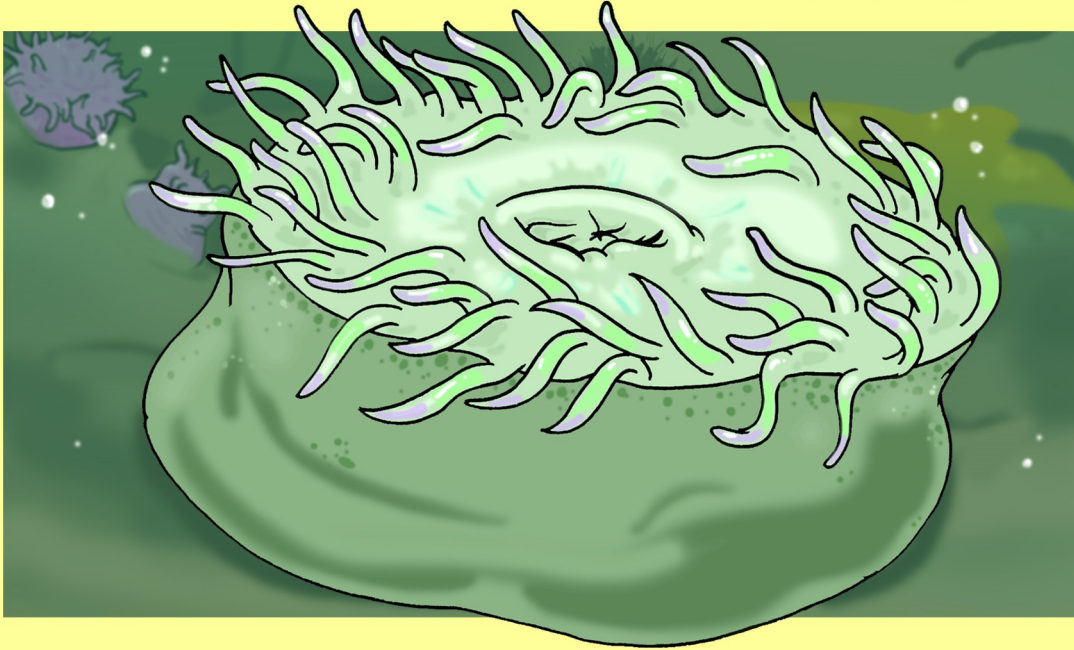
Do not stay! Swim away!

A bottlenose dolphin calf needs lots of care, as there are many dangers in the ocean.



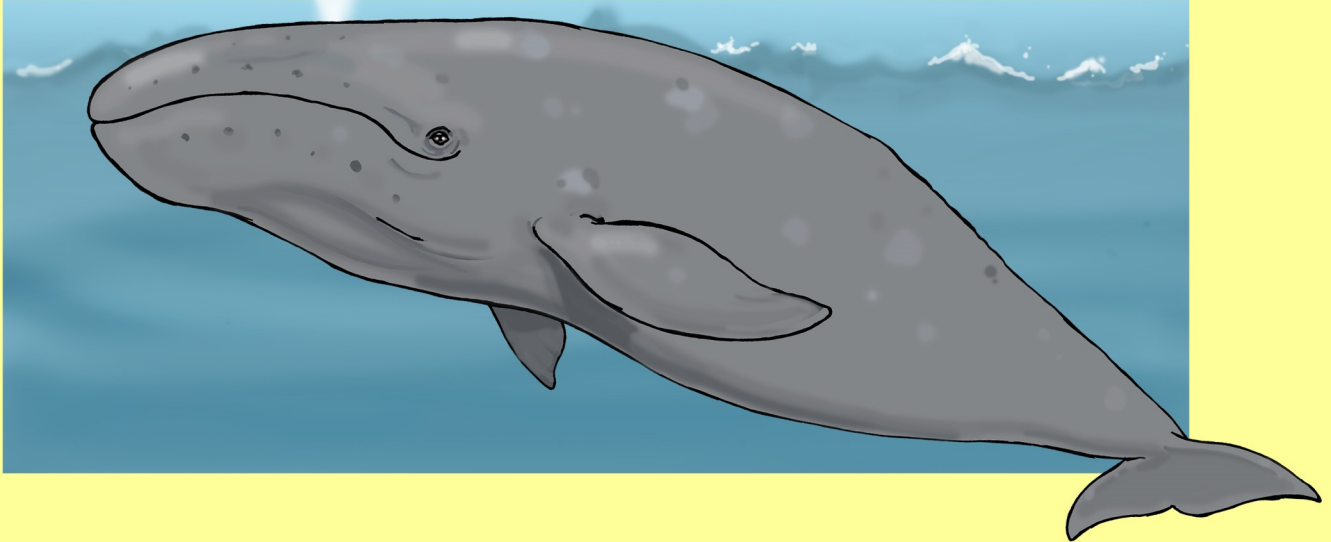
Do not stray away from mum.
