
Seeds and Trees











BEFORE YOU START...

The child reads the big, bold type. This contains the most common words, words that can be decoded or words containing the sound being learnt.




The text in the corner is just for the adult or reading partner. This is to develop the child's vocabulary and promote discussion.



Say "ee" (as in "see").

Say it quiet, say it loud and say it silly! Trace the letters with your finger... Let's go!

Bees transport pollen between flowers. This causes them to produce seeds.




A bee can feed here.

Some plants, like dandelions, spread their seeds by wind. The breeze carries away these tiny seeds far and wide.

This weed is full of seeds.

Lots of seeds are surrounded by sweet fruits so that they are eaten and spread by animals.



There is seed under the green peel.

Brightly coloured fruits, and the seeds they contain, are eaten by birds like this waxwing.



I need seeds from trees.

Woodmice scamper through the leaves as they search for food that has fallen from the trees above.



My teeth help get in to the seed.

This jay has an amazing memory and knows exactly where it has hidden its stash of acorns.



I get big seeds from up in the trees.




I hid it deep with my feet.

The green bit pops free.


