




"ou" as in out




BEFORE YOU START...

This contains the most common words, words that can be decoded or words containing the sound being learnt.




___ The text in the corner is just for the adult or reading partner. This is to develop the child's vocabulary and promote discussion.




Say "ou" (as in "out").

Echidnas have long, sticky tongues to collect the ants, termites and




My snout will sniff about for ants.

I like it here in mum's pouch.




I am found on the ground.
