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BEFORE YOU START...

The child reads the big, bold type. This contains the most common words, words that can be decoded or words containing the sound being learnt.



The text in the corner is just for the adult or reading partner. This is to develop the child's vocabulary and promote discussion.

A bald eagle has enormous talons that act like fishing hooks to snatch fish from the water.



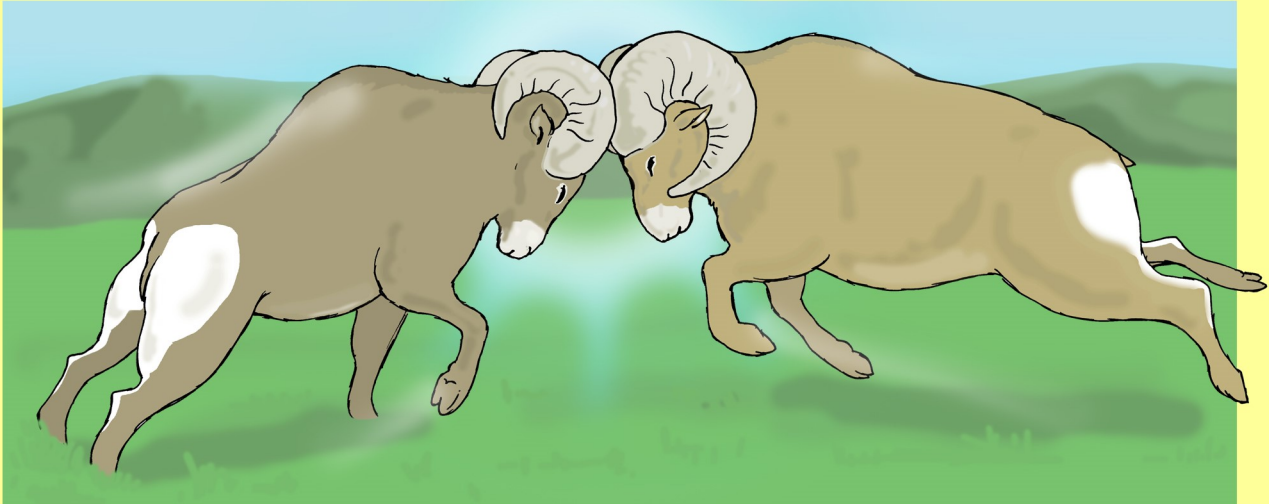
Wow! It drops down for a fish.
