Writing and comprehension: <u>Penguins</u>

Penguins are a special group of birds. They all share the similar features such as a covering of black and white feathers, although the markings vary greatly. The feathers are very dense to keep them warm in the chilly Antarctic waters.

Whilst penguins do not fly, they have powerful wings that propel them through the water. Their ability to swim with great speed and agility is helped by having streamlined bodies . Such mobility means that they are excellent predators of fish, krill and squid.

On land penguins are not so graceful, but need to come on to land to lay eggs and raise their young. Eggs would not survive in the water, and even on the ice they need to have constant care. To begin with, this is the role of the male, who balances the single egg (after the female has laid it) on the top of his feet, under a flap of warm tummy feathers. The mother leaves them to fetch food from the ocean before returning with a well needed meal.






