



This contains the most common words, words that can be decoded or words containing the sound being learnt.




___ The text in the corner is just for the adult or reading partner. This is to develop the child's vocabulary and promote discussion.



Say "ea" (as in "sea").


Say it quiet, say it loud and say it silly! Trace the letters with your finger... Let's go!

Nurse sharks use sensitive barbels on their snouts to detect food hidden on the seabed.




I dig in the sand for my meal.

Striped pilot fish help this oceanic whitetip shark by eating pests that live on her rough skin.




A team helps me to get clean.

Wobbegong sharks use their elaborate camouflage to stay hidden on the seabed and ambush any prey that passses too closely.




I can reach up for my meal.

Thresher sharks have incredibly long tails which they use like a whip, stunning their fish prey.




I slap my long fin to get a meal.

Great hammerheads come into shallow waters to hunt stingrays. They use their wide head to pin down prey.

Many sharks, like this whitetip reef shark, stop diseases spreading by eating any weak or injured fish.

Great whites spy-hop (raising their heads out of the water) to look for signs of seals and sea lions above the surface.






