



Say it quiet, say it loud and say it silly! Trace the letters with your finger... Let's go!




### A wombat is round and stout.

My snout sniffs around for ants.




I like it here in mum's pouch.

The numbat has an extraordinarily long tongue which it uses to invade underground nests so that it may feed on ants




A numbat dips in to ground.




