Don't Become A Seatbelt Statistic

- Since January 1, 1999 72% of the 65 people killed in motor vehicle crashes in Delaware were not wearing seatbelts.
- Approximately 32% of unbelted fatalities from January through August were ejected from their vehicles. (DE State Police)
- Ejected occupants are 4 times more likely to be killed as those who remain inside vehicle.
- The best way to get kids buckled up is to buckle adults. (source: NHTSA)
- Seatbelts are the most effective safety devices available in vehicles, estimated to save 9,500 lives each year. (Source: NHT5A)
- A belted driver has a better chance of maintaining control of the vehicle in the event of a crash.
- Every hour, at least one American dies because he or she didn't buckle up. (NRTSA)
- Failure to buckle up contributes to more fatalities than any other single traffic safety-related behavior. (NHTSA)
