Review: What sort of person makes a good Trustee?

- 1. They Have a Trust.
- 2. You Trust them.
- 3. They possess a sense of responsibility to their appointment.
- 4. Understand the requirement for Confidentiality & Privacy.
- 5. Can make decisions for the sole benefit of the Beneficiaries.
- 6. Prepared to devote some time to gain knowledge and understanding to manage and administer the Trust.

What to Place in Your Trust



Legally speaking any lawful item may be placed into a Private Trust.

However, practical considerations must apply.

The following considerations are designed to assist you make the best decision.

Does it have Intrinsic Value?

What to Place in Your Trust



Will it keep its value or better still will it increase in value?

What to Place in Your Trust



Do I want to sell it before I die?

What to Place in Your Trust



Does it create a cash flow?

What to Place in Your Trust



Is it a valuable collectable?

What to Place in Your Trust



Do my Beneficiaries want to use it?

What to Place in Your Trust



Can the item be easily converted to cash?

What to Place in Your Trust



Will it provide me with a 'safety net'?

What to Place in Your Trust



It is therefore important to select the appropriate Trust/s to enable you to achieve your objectives.

The Trust Fund Register



The transactions of all items placed into the Trust and all consequential settlements must be recorded in the Trust Fund Register

The Trust Fund Register



The responsibility to maintain and keep the Trust Fund Register accurate and up to date lies with the Board of Trustees
