THE MUSIC

"Guard What You Hear — Let Heaven Fill Your Ears"

Music is powerful.

It can move hearts, stir emotions, and even shape the atmosphere around us.

From the beginning, sound has been a spiritual force — when God *spoke*, creation began.

That's why what we choose to listen to matters deeply.

As followers of Christ, we must recognize that every song carries a spirit — and not every spirit is holy.

The enemy knows the power of music.

Lucifer himself was once the anointed cherub who led heavenly worship (Ezekiel 28:13–15). Now he uses distorted rhythms and deceptive lyrics to distract, deceive, and desensitize hearts to sin.

But as children of God, our ears must be tuned to the frequency of heaven.

Key Scripture Reading (NKJV)

- **Philippians** 4:8 "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure... if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things."
- **Colossians 3:16** "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

• **Psalm 150:6** – "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord!"

Remember this:

1. Music Shapes the Mind and Spirit

What you feed your ears feeds your soul. When you constantly hear lyrics of lust, pride, anger, or rebellion, those seeds plant themselves in your heart. But **Worship** and **Godly music** renew your mind and refresh your spirit with peace.

2. God Designed Music for Worship

From David's harp to the heavenly choirs in Revelation, music has always been a tool for praise, prayer, and proclamation. It's not meant for ego — it's intended for exaltation to Lift!

3. The Devil Distorts What God Designed

He uses music to glorify darkness and draw people away from holiness. The beats may sound good, but the message can be poison. Every song has a message — listen beyond the melody.

4. Worship Is a Weapon

In 2 Chronicles 20, the people of Judah sent worshipers ahead of the army — and God fought their battle! Worship changes the atmosphere and invites God's presence.

5. Instrumental and Soaking Worship Matter Too

Sometimes, words aren't even needed. Instrumental worship helps you meditate, pray, and hear God clearly. It creates a peaceful space for the Holy Spirit to speak.

What we should do as Christians - Christ Followers

1. Guard Your Playlist.

Go through your phone, car, or streaming app and delete any music that doesn't honor God. Ask yourself, "Would I listen to this with Jesus sitting next to me?"

2. Fill Your Atmosphere with Worship.

Play Christian instrumentals, praise music, and anointed worship throughout your home. Let peace become the soundtrack of your life.

3. Teach the Next Generation.

Help your children and grandchildren understand the importance of Godly music. Show them that worship is not boring — it's powerful!

4. Use Music for Healing and Deliverance.

Worship drives out darkness. Remember David playing for Saul? (1 Samuel 16:23) The evil spirit left because the anointing was on the music! (AMEN!!!!!!)))))

5. Sing to the Lord Daily.

Whether in your car, shower, or prayer closet, lift up a song of gratitude. God inhabits the praises of His people (Psalm 22:3).
