

God is

- **Omnipresent** or **Omnipresence** = God is present everywhere
- **Omnipotent** = God is all-powerful
- **Omniscient** = God is all-knowing

- **Eternal** = God has no beginning and no end
- **Holy** = completely pure and set apart
- **Sovereign** = God rules and reigns over all
- **Immutable** = God does not change
- **Faithful** = God always keeps His word
- **Love** = God is love

Scripture

Exodus 3:14 (NKJV) “And God said to Moses, ‘I AM WHO I AM.’ And He said, ‘Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, “I AM has sent me to you.”’

Who God is cannot be fully measured by the human mind, because God is greater than words, bigger than our understanding, and holier than anything we have ever known. Yet in His love, He reveals Himself to us through His Word. God does not leave us guessing. He tells us who He is.

When life gets shaky, we need to know who God is.

When the world gets loud, we need to know who God is.

When fear tries to creep in, we need to know who God is.

When we are hurting, praying, waiting, or believing, we need to know who God is.

The Bible shows us that God is not just powerful, but personal. He is not just high and lifted up, but near to the brokenhearted. He is not just Creator, but Father. He is not just Judge, but Savior. He is not just mighty, but merciful.

Today we are going to look at what the Word says God is.

1. GOD IS ETERNAL

Psalm 90:2 (NKJV)

“Before the mountains were brought forth, Or ever You had formed the earth and the world, Even from everlasting to everlasting, You are God.”

God had no beginning and He has no end. Nobody created God. Nobody taught God. Nobody formed Him. He has always been God. Before there was time, there was God. Before there was earth, there was God. Before there was breath in our lungs, there was God.

He is the everlasting God. He does not age, weaken, drift, or change with the times.

Isaiah 40:28 (NKJV)

“Have you not known? Have you not heard? The everlasting God, the Lord, The Creator of the ends of the earth, Neither faints nor is weary. His understanding is unsearchable.”

What this means: God will never run out of strength. He will never retire from being God.

2. GOD IS CREATOR

Genesis 1:1 (NKJV) “In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.”

God is the Creator of all things. Heaven, earth, stars, oceans, mountains, animals, and mankind were made by Him. We are not accidents. We are created by God with purpose.

Colossians 1:16 (NKJV) “For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible... All things were created through Him and for Him.”

Everything belongs to Him because He made it. The One who created the world is the same God who knows your name.

What this means:

If God created all things, then He has authority over all things.

3. GOD IS HOLY

Isaiah 6:3 (NKJV) “And one cried to another and said: ‘Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!’”

God is holy. That means He is completely pure, righteous, perfect, and set apart from all sin. There is no darkness in Him. No corruption in Him. No evil in Him. No flaw in Him.

Revelation 4:8 (NKJV) “Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, Who was and is and is to come!”

God is holy all the time. He does not have good days and bad days. He does not have weak moments. He is forever holy.

What this means: We should approach God with reverence, honor, worship, and humble hearts.

4. GOD IS SPIRIT

John 4:24 (NKJV) “God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.”

God is not limited like man. He is Spirit. He is not confined to one building, one place, or one location. He is not boxed in by human hands.

Because God is Spirit, true worship is not just outward form. It must come from the heart. God is looking for sincere worshipers.

What this means: God wants real worship, not empty routine.

5. GOD IS LIGHT

1 John 1:5 (NKJV) “This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all.”

God is light. He exposes truth. He reveals what is hidden. He leads us out of darkness, confusion, and sin. There is no darkness in Him at all. None. Not a shadow. Not a stain. Not a hint.

What this means: If we walk with God, we are walking toward truth.

6. GOD IS LOVE

1 John 4:8 (NKJV) “He who does not love does not know God, for God is love.”

1 John 4:9-10 (NKJV)

“In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.”

God is love. His love is not weak, flaky, or temporary. God’s love is active. His love reaches. His love saves. His love forgives. His love corrects. His love comforts.

The cross is proof of the love of God. Jesus did not come because we were so worthy. He came because God is so loving.

What this means: God’s love is not based on our perfection. It is based on His nature.

7. GOD IS FAITHFUL

Deuteronomy 7:9 (NKJV)

“Therefore know that the Lord your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy for a thousand generations with those who love Him and keep His commandments.”

Lamentations 3:22-23 (NKJV)

“Through the Lord’s mercies we are not consumed,
Because His compassions fail not.
They are new every morning;
Great is Your faithfulness.”

God is faithful. He keeps His Word. He does not lie. He does not forget. He does not make empty promises. He is faithful in every season.

What this means: You can trust God completely.

8. GOD IS MERCIFUL AND GRACIOUS

Psalm 103:8 (NKJV) “The Lord is merciful and gracious, Slow to anger, and abounding in mercy.”

God is not harsh with His children. He is merciful. He is gracious. He is patient. He does not treat us as our sins deserve when we repent and come to Him. He gives what we do not deserve, and He withholds judgment we rightly deserve through Christ.

What this means: There is room at the feet of Jesus for the repentant heart.

9. GOD IS JUST AND RIGHTEOUS

Deuteronomy 32:4 (NKJV)

“He is the Rock, His work is perfect; For all His ways are justice, A God of truth and without injustice; Righteous and upright is He.”

God is just. He is righteous. He always does what is right. He never makes a wrong decision. He never perverts justice. He never overlooks truth. The whole earth can trust His judgments.

What this means: Even when we do not understand everything, God is still right.

10. GOD IS OUR REFUGE AND STRENGTH

Psalm 46:1 (NKJV) “God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble.”

God is not far away in trouble. He is a **very present help**. Not a late help. Not a maybe help. A very present help. When storms rise, God is our shelter. When strength is gone, God is our strength.

What this means: Run to God first, not last.

11. GOD IS OUR SHEPHERD

Psalm 23:1 (NKJV)

“The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.”

A shepherd leads, feeds, protects, corrects, and watches over the sheep. God is not careless with His people. He shepherds us with wisdom and love.

What this means: God knows how to lead your life better than you do.

12. GOD IS A CONSUMING FIRE

Hebrews 12:29 (NKJV) “For our God is a consuming fire.”

This reminds us that God is powerful, pure, and worthy of reverence. He burns away what is unholy. He is not to be treated casually. God is loving, but He is also glorious, mighty, and holy beyond words.

What this means: We should not play around with the things of God.

13. GOD IS OUR FATHER

2 Corinthians 6:18 (NKJV) “I will be a Father to you, And you shall be My sons and daughters, Says the Lord Almighty.”

God is Father to those who belong to Him through Christ. He loves, provides, disciplines, teaches, and welcomes His children. He is not distant. He is relational.

Matthew 6:9 (NKJV) “In this manner, therefore, pray:
Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name.”

What this means: We can come boldly to Him in prayer with love and reverence.

14. GOD IS ONE

Deuteronomy 6:4 (NKJV) “Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one!”

There is only one true God. He alone is worthy of worship. He alone is sovereign. He alone is the Lord.

What this means: We do not serve a made-up god, a weak god, or one among many. We serve the one true living God.

15. GOD IS FOR US

Romans 8:31 (NKJV) “What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?”

When we belong to Christ, we do not walk alone. God is for us. He is working, helping, strengthening, guiding, and sustaining His people.

What this means: The believer can walk in courage because God is on our side.

When you know God is your Father, you stop living like you are abandoned.

Conclusion

He is still holy.

He is still faithful.

He is still mighty.

He is still loving.

He is still the Great I AM.

People change. Circumstances change. Feelings change. Nations change. Seasons change. But God does not change.

Malachi 3:6 (NKJV) “For I am the Lord, I do not change...”

The God who made a way before will make a way again.
