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# The Hidden Estate: The Assets Your Estate Plan Is Missing Right Now

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Your will covers what you can see. Your trust protects what you listed. Your estate plan addresses the assets your attorney knew to ask about. But what about everything else?

The cryptocurrency sitting in a cold wallet with no recovery phrase documented. The art collection appraised fifteen years ago. The mineral rights generating royalties for decades. The business interest nobody thought to include. The jewelry with no provenance documentation.

These are the hidden estate assets. And in 2026, with \$600 billion in cryptocurrency estimated to become permanently inaccessible due to inadequate estate planning, the hidden estate is not a detail. It is the difference between a legacy and a loss.

## Cryptocurrency: The \$600 Billion Disappearing Act

Cryptocurrency is held in wallets secured by private keys — long strings of characters that are the only way to access the funds. There is no bank to call. There is no court order that can open a wallet without the private key. When the key is lost, or when the person who knew it dies without documenting it, the funds are permanently inaccessible. Forever. No exceptions.

### THE \$600 BILLION NUMBER

Chainalysis estimates that approximately \$600 billion in Bitcoin alone may be permanently inaccessible due to lost private keys and the deaths of holders who did not document their access information. That number grows every year.

## What Cryptocurrency Holders Must Document

- The type and amount of each cryptocurrency held
- The wallet type — hardware wallet, software wallet, exchange account
- The private key or seed phrase — stored securely, physically, not digitally
- The exchange accounts and login credentials in a secure password manager

#### **THE CRITICAL WARNING**

Never store your private key or seed phrase digitally — not in email, not in the cloud, not in a notes app. Store it physically in a secure location. Tell your executor where it is. This is the only documentation that stands between your heirs and permanent loss.

## **Art, Jewelry, and Collectibles: The Valuation Problem**

Collections are frequently the most emotionally significant items in an estate and the most financially chaotic. A collection appraised fifteen years ago that has appreciated dramatically since the last valuation. Pieces with no provenance documentation. Items insured below their current replacement value.

***“The art collection appraised at \$180,000 in 2009 may be worth \$800,000 today. Or \$40,000. Without a current independent appraisal, your estate plan is working from a number that may bear no relationship to reality.”***

## **Mineral Rights: The Asset People Forget They Own**

Mineral rights can be one of the most valuable assets in an estate — and one of the most overlooked. Mineral rights that are actively producing generate monthly royalty payments that have a calculable present value. If they are not documented, the royalty payments may stop flowing to the right people.

## **Business Interests: The Partnership Your Attorney Never Asked About**

LLC membership interests. Partnership stakes. Shareholder agreements in private companies. A business interest that transfers at death subject to a right of first refusal. A shareholder agreement that restricts transfer to non-family members. These create significant uncertainty and must be specifically identified and addressed.

### THE QUESTION TO ASK

Does your estate attorney have a copy of every operating agreement, shareholder agreement, and partnership agreement for every business interest you hold? If the answer is no — your estate plan has a gap.

## The Hidden Asset Inventory: Build This Document This Week

The hidden asset inventory is the document that allows your executor, your attorney, and your family to find everything you own. Eight categories to document:

## Frequently Asked Questions

### **Is cryptocurrency community property in a California divorce?**

In California, assets acquired during the marriage are generally community property regardless of whose name they are in. Cryptocurrency acquired during the marriage is community property. The challenge in divorce proceedings is discovery — forensic analysis may be required to uncover non-disclosed crypto holdings.

### **How do I value a business interest in my estate?**

Business interests are valued using income, market, or asset approaches depending on the type of business. A certified business valuator with the CVA or ABV credential should perform the valuation. The operating or shareholder agreement may also specify a valuation method.

### **What happens to my art collection if I die without documenting it?**

Your executor must identify, locate, and value every piece — a process that can take months and significant expense. Pieces without provenance documentation may be difficult to sell or authenticate. Family members may dispute who was promised which piece, with no written evidence to resolve the conflict.
