HUNTING

Oklahoma Wildlife: Oklahoma Wild Life Department

Licenses: Oklahoma Hunting Licensing

Must be: 18+ and must hold a current, valid Oklahoma Driver's License / ID for a minimum of 60 days to be classified as a Resident

Deer Hunting - The Most Popular Hunting Season in Oklahoma

Oklahoma is one of the best states in the nation for whitetail deer hunting, and it's big business for Oklahoma with an estimated total economic impact of over \$600 million a year!

Fueling that deer hunting popularity is a management plan that serves our diverse hunters' interests along with a strong education component outlining the benefits of balanced sex ratios and selective buck harvest.

Oklahoma Hunting Regulations for Privately Owned Land:

Landowners or Tenants

Resident landowners or tenants who hunt only on land owned or agriculturally leased by them (not including hunting leases) are exempt from the hunting license. Resident landowners who hunt waterfowl and other migratory game birds only on their own property are exempt from the Oklahoma waterfowl license and HIP requirements.

Only resident landowners or tenants or such individuals' children who trap on land owned or agriculturally leased by such owners or agricultural lessees (not including hunting leases) are exempt from purchasing a trapping license.

Persons residing in another state who own land in Oklahoma but do not live on that land are considered nonresidents and are not exempt.



Landowners or Agricultural Lessees

Landowners or agricultural lessees who kill bobcats, raccoons, gray/red foxes or river otters actually found destroying livestock or poultry are exempt from the purchase of the fur license.

No landowner or agricultural lessee who takes these species under the depredation exemption may remove any part of the fur or un-skinned carcass from the premises where taken.

Landowners or agricultural lessees taking fur bearers in open season with intent to sell must possess a fur license. This license is not required for those who run or chase fur bearers with dogs but do not take.

Disability

Residents having a proven permanent disability which renders them non-ambulatory and confines them to a wheelchair, as certified by a medical doctor, are exempt from the hunting license.

Proof of Exemption

Proof of exemption from a license or permit must be carried while in the field. State Regulations: http://www.eregulations.com/oklahoma/hunting/license-exemptions/

OKLAHOMA

Question: Can I carry in Oklahoma if I have a license from another state?

Answer: Oklahoma recognizes any valid concealed or unconcealed carry weapons permit or license issued by another state. If you are from a state that allows you to carry a handgun but does not issue permits or licenses, Oklahoma reciprocates under the permitting law of your state.

Note: If carrying under permits-less carry you must be 21. If you have a permit/license from any state you can carry in Oklahoma at 18. Their reciprocity law did not change with the passage of Permit-less Carry. They still honor all other states Permit/Licenses with no age restriction when having a valid permit/license.

Oklahoma Camping Tips

- * The best time to camp in Oklahoma is during the spring or fall, before the summer heat and humidity kick in fully and before it gets too cool in the late fall. Weather remains mild throughout September and into October, making fall a great camping season. Spring mornings can be chilly, so make sure to dress in layers that you can peel off as temperatures rise throughout the day.
- * Summers in Oklahoma can be hot and humid. July and August tend to see peak summer heat, so if you're camping during these months, remember to pack plenty of water and sunscreen.
- * Tent campers will find hundreds of campgrounds around Oklahoma lakes, making the state a great destination for water recreation and fishing lovers. If you plan on fishing, make sure to have a current Oklahoma fishing license. You can purchase your Oklahoma fishing license online or at local sporting goods stores, bait/tackle shops, convenience stores and even large discount centers, like Wal-Mart. Note: Children under 16 do not need a fishing license in Oklahoma.
- * Most campgrounds in Oklahoma will have both small charcoal grills and fire rings available. If you decide to build a campfire, you should not have a problem finding adequate firewood. Please check with park staff, a ranger or camp host before gathering wood from the area surrounding your campground. Some parks and campgrounds allow campers to gather wood from the forest floor, while others prohibit the practice and offer firewood for sale. Do not bring wood from outside the park, as the wood may carry harmful insects or tree diseases into the park.

- * Remember to observe all local burn bans. Check the current burn ban status before lighting your campfire.
- * Arrive early. Currently, most Oklahoma state parks and many other campgrounds do not take tent camping reservations. Therefore, camping availability is on a first come, first served basis.
- * Leave no trace behind when you leave. Preserve Oklahoma's beautiful outdoor spaces by leaving the ecosystem completely undisturbed when you pack up camp. Pick up after yourself, use established fire rings, keep campfires small or cook on a camp stove, and remember to wash dishes in wash tubs at least 200 feet away from all streams, lakes or waterways. For the safety of the animals and campers, please keep your distance from wildlife and do not feed the animals. Help Oklahoma maintain its natural resources for future generations!

AREA LAKE


Area Description/Facilities: There are three campgrounds located around the lake offering
