

River Birch - 'Dura Heat'



LEAF COLOR: A more heat and drought tolerant form of this species. Densely pyramidal form with glossy green leaves that fade to clear butter yellow in fall.

Winter bark is pinkish-orange with prominent exfoliation.

Deciduous tree usually keeping leaves late into fall. Early frost can make brown leaves.

HABIT: Densely Pyramidal

CULTURE: Needs full sun. Prefer wet moist soil. The non-toxic trees are safe near horses and livestock. Large tree as focal point or for shading.

GROWTH RATE: Fast growing

FLOWER: Catkins, bloom in spring. Inconspicuous

FRUIT: Small nut like seed in the spring
