
Tom Wright is the featured artist at the Bakersfield Art Center for the month of August. Join him for a reception on first Friday, August 1st from 6 PM to 8 PM

Tom spent his first year Bakersfield College studying basic design and basic drawing. Financially he could only afford one year of college but that
