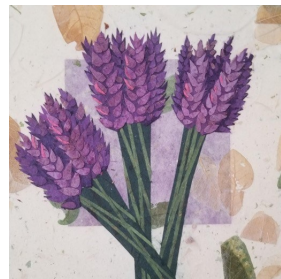
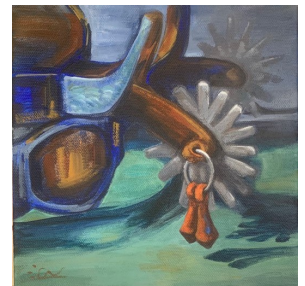
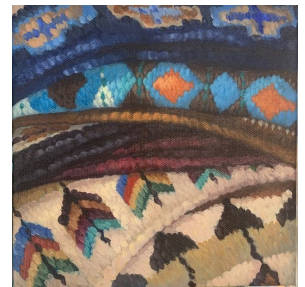
The Bakersfield Art Center will feature miniature works by local artists and members of the Bakersfield Art Association which is located at 1607 19th St. in Bakersfield.

DAGNY'S FEATURED ARTIST

"Fur and Feathered Friends of our Planet" Edwina knew she wanted to draw animals all through elementary and high school. She entered local art shows and side walk festivals. During that time she became friends with local wildlife artist Barbara Fiser and benefited from her instruction in that genre.

During her college years, BC professor Clayton Rippey encouraged her to expand her use of color and to better understand the importance of the anatomy hidden under all that fur and feathers! She graduated from Cal State Bakersfield with a BA in Fine Art.

After college, during her 12-year tour of duty in the Marine Corps she was fortunate to be stationed at Camp Pendleton for five years. She found personal time for drawing and painting and was able to become a member of the newly opened Wild Animal Park in Escondido, CA. She spent her free time plein air painting in the Park studying the wild animals

and birds in their natural settings.

After completing her military service in 1982, Edwina returned to Bakersfield to begin a



career in commercial video production. In 1985 she worked as a Media Services Coordinator for the Kern County and Bakersfield Fire Departments. Edwina found time to return to her passion of studying animals and depicting them using different media and techniques. She says, "We all need to support the preservation of all the wildlands and wildlife of this planet. Doing so will preserve our lives as well".

"The study of art is a lifetime matter. The best any artist can do is to accumulate all the knowledge possible of art and its principles, study nature often, and then practice continually."

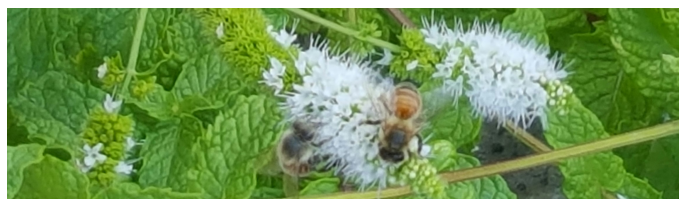

Gordon specializes in local landscape paintings depicting the gritty that is the San Joaquin Valley often adding brightness and drama to his pieces. He lives in Bakersfield, CA with his husband, Robert of 25 years, and their four dogs, Eunice, Douggie, Dexter, and Sassy.

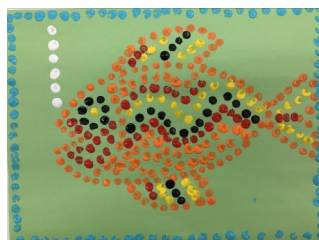

DAVID GORDON WORKSHOP!

“Value Key Landscape Painting” 1 day Workshop by David Gordon, March 25, 830-am-4pm, oil painting. Ever wonder how to paint the dust in Kern County? Curious how to paint haze versus a clear horizon? Hone your values to get more from them in this one-day workshop that explores how to paint limited value ranges. The class will create a simple nine range value scale to paint three small pieces using high key, mid-key, and low-key values. Color will be introduced into each value range to create a more sophisticated and accurate landscape. The one-day workshop will focus on exercises in this fast-paced day of value explorations that will improve your work.

Supplies: 2-3 11x14 canvas panels. Preferably a step above the cheaper canvas boards. Thin masking tape to tape off canvas. Oil paint set up. Stand up easel. Tabletop easels will be provided if that is preferable. There is still time to sign up for the workshop. Cost is \$65 for members and \$75 for non-members.

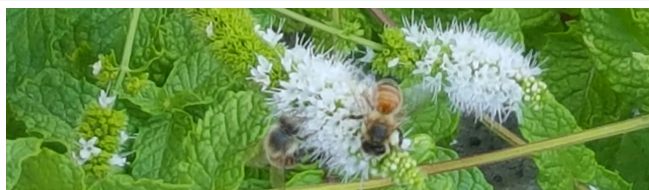

The BAA will be partnering with “Bring Back the Kern” organization to publicize the benefits of bringing back the Kern River through Bakersfield. We have reserved the month of **April** for a group show that will showcase Art of the Kern River.
