#### PLEIN AIR ART SHOW IN APRIL


The Bakersfield Art Association is presenting a collection of sketches by local artists outside their studio through April. A Reception will be on First Friday, April 6th from 6 to 8 PM The Art Center is located at 607 19th Street, Bakersfield.

"When I sit down to make a sketch from nature, the first thing I try Is forget that I have ever seen a picture," said Constable, the artist credited with being the premier En Plein Air painter. John Constable (1776-1837) was a British artist on the Suffolk countryside where he lived. En plein air Is a French phrase meaning "in the open air." Today artists tend to shorten the term to Plein Air. The Bakersfield Art Association sponsors plein air activities each week on Tuesday and Saturday mornings. They take place at locations in the Kern County Museum. The Saturday activity Is at various locations in Kern County, including Hart Park.

Historically, landscape painting dates back to the Renaissance with artists creating sketches that would be used as reference photos in studio paintings. With the invention of the metal rollers for paint and patented by John G Rand in 1841, artists were more easily able to take their pallets and easels into countryside to paint. Before then, handmade oil paints were stored in sections of a pig's, bladder, and a hole was poked into the lining to squeeze paint onto the pallet.

About The Artist: Bakersfield based artist and New York native, Lisa has explored multiple mediums throughout her life, with an early interest in all forms of




artistic expression ranging from woodworking, interior design, photography to sketching and painting. This multifaceted approach and broad love for all things art

#### SATELLITE ART SHOWS IN BUSINESSES GUIDELINES

So that all BAA members have a chance to exhibit, an artist must wait one year before exhibiting at the same location a second time.

All BAA members, who have been juried, may participate in BAA Satellite Art Shows. All art work submitted must be original with the artist. All reference photographs, used in the creative process, must be taken by the artist. Put the title of the painting/photograph, medium, copyright date/date painted, artist's name, address and phone number of the back of every painting/photograph. 16" x 20" is the recommended size. 11" x 14" is OK. Some locations may take larger pieces. D-rings only. All work must have a wire for hanging. Please tape wire end using transparent shipping tape. Wires must hang two inches from the top of the frame when the painting/photograph is hung.

· Pick up price tags for Satellite Art Shows at the Art Center office, in the third drawer of the file cabinet, and use a black pen when writing on the labels. Labels will be taped on the bottom right corner or the frame with transparent shipping tape. 30% or 40% commission depending on location. When purchases are made, the artist must turn in the total price, plus the tax, to the Treasurer and in BAA Satellite Art Show.
