her favorite ones are colored pencil and pen and ink.


Jeanette says, "When I moved to

SATELLITE ART SHOWS IN BUSINESSES GUIDELINES

· So that all BAA members have a chance to exhibit, an artist must wait one year before exhibiting at the same location a second time.

All BAA members, who have been juried, may participate in BAA Satellite Art Shows. All art work submitted must be original with the artist. All reference photographs, used in the creative process, must be taken by the artist. Put the title of the painting/photograph, medium, copyright date/date painted, artist's name, address and phone number of the back of every painting/photograph. 16" x 20" is the recommended size. I I" x 14" is OK. Some locations may take larger pieces. Drings only. All work must have a wire for hanging. Please tape wire end using transparent shipping tape. Wires must hang two inches from the top of the frame when the painting/photograph is hung.

Pick up price tags for Satellite Art Shows at the Art Center office, in the third drawer of the file cabinet, and use a black pen when writing on the labels. Labels will be taped on the bottom right corner or the frame with transparent shipping tape. 30% or 40% commission depending on location. When purchases are made, the artist must turn in the total price, plus the tax, to the Treasurer and in BAA Satellite Art Show.

VICKIE MEADOWS at the SHAFTER LIBRARY

A new exhibit is on display in the lobby of the Shater Library for the summer months. Shafter residents can enjoy paintings by Vicki Meadows of the Bakersfield Art Association. And if you fall in love with one of them, they're available for purchase.

Vickie has been interested in art since she was a child. By high school, she was doing oil paintings. One day her father took one of her paintings to a local gallery for a critique. She was told that she painted like an architect which she really wanted to be. But due to the times, her high school wouldn't let her enroll in the architectural drawing class. Before long she ended up putting her paint supplies away and got on with her "mom" life, painting occasionally in acrylic for family members. She began painting again in earnest about seven years ago. It wasn't until her mother was suffering with Parkinson's that a doctor caring for her mother asked Vickie if she would paint and donate something for a Michael J. Fox Foundation fundraiser in Hollywood. Although she hadn't painted seriously in 40 years, she agreed, painting a landscape of lavender fields. That helped her rediscover her love of painting.

Although she has always been drawn to old buildings and other structures, she also paints landscapes, people and pets, along with the occasional still life. In the last few years, her paintings have been displayed at Dagny's Coffee Shop, Covenant Coffee, Kern Literacy Council and local doctors, also at the Kern County Fair.
