DAGNY'S FEATURED ARTIST

Roline Loung Witt was born in Glen Cove, New York. Her Father, was a metallurgist who liked to travel. Roline's mother, on the other hand, was an artist who was teaching at the college level by the time she was 18. She could play 5 musical instruments; occasionally on the radio. She took up watercolors when she was in her 60's.

Following her mother's lead, Roline took up sketching in her 60's. When she was a child, her father took the family on a European tour which included a trip on the Queen Mary. Later, they lived in Vienna for 7 months, where Roline and her sister learned some German so they could attend the local school. After the sojourn in Vienna, the family moved to San Francisco before settling in Palo Alto. Sometimes, Roline's father would conduct scientific experiments in order to explain some school problem in the sciences. Roline's mother taught her to needlepoint, how to play the piano and the musical saw. Early on, Roline's father had taught her mother how to cook, by conducting food experiments in the kitchen until he had several recipes down pat. In turn, Roline's mother taught her how to cook once she reached college ade.

Roline graduated from the University of California, Santa Cruz and then attended Claremont Graduate School for a year. She married Gary Witt, who went to UCSC also. They lived in Anaheim until Gary graduated from Pepperdine Law School and became a Deputy District Attorney in Bakersfield. Roline held jobs at a Savings and Loan, at a Title company and she also taught for a year at California State University at Bakersfield. They had three daughters, all of whom have started their own lives and careers. The



eldest teaches in Laguna; the middle daughter is an environmental scientist for the State of California and the youngest is a Supply Officer for the United States Navy.

Roline has had an interest in animals since childhood. When she was 7 years old, she watched for the horses and dogs in the famous paintings that they saw in the museums, churches, and palaces they

visited. After she married, her needlepoint, cross stitch, tatting and Sculpey projects usually centered on animals. When she took up stained glass 12 years ago, animals, particularly tigers, continued to dominate her projects.. Since she started sketching in May of 2013, on the plane to Hawaii to visit her in-laws, Roline has sketched many dogs and cats, often for friends, family or for commissions. She is now exploring the various painting mediums--oil, watercolor, pastel and silk (ink) painting. Many animals are still slated to be painted, but the stunning colors of the sunset and ocean also beckon now. Roline is enjoying learning to use the various mediums to advantage in order to inspire a feeling or connection with each piece of art. Sunsets and seascapes can be turbulent or serene. Animals can be curious or intent or even contemplative. Roline's daughters and husband often send her photographs she can use as references for seascapes or animals so her painting is a family affair.

Put the title of the painting, medium, copyright date/date painted, artist's name, address, and phone number **on the back** of every painting/ photograph. 16" x 20" recommend size. 11" x 14" is ok. Some locations may take larger pieces. D -rings only. All work must have a wire for hanging. Please tape wire ends. No masking tape. Pick up price tags for Satellite Art Shows at the gallery, and bring a black ballpoint pen for invoices. 30% to 40% commission depending on location. When purchases are made, the artist must turn in the total price of the art sold, plus the tax, to the Treasurer. The Treasurer will then issue checks to the artist and the Satellite Art Show Hosts.
