#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

#### To all B.C. Horse Shoe Clubs:

We all pitch shoes because we love the game. We don't play because we want to make money, in fact playing shoes costs money. More and more all our clubs are being threatened by outside entities which seem to be trying to force us out of our club areas.

Support from local politicians and Parks Departments is at an all-time low.

Some clubs have had to stop hosting tournaments as their municipalities want to charge them for the use of the courts. It is getting more expensive to play and the cost to attend other clubs' tournaments is so high that many pitchers don't go to away tournaments. The cost for ferry fares, gas, and especially hotel or accommodations is a definite deterrent to travel.

It is time that we got together to do something about it. I believe that if we can cut down on travel expenses we could get more players travelling to away tournaments. The more players we have at a tournament the more exposure our sport gets. The biggest expense is accommodation. I suggest that all the clubs approach their members and start a list for billeting away players. A lot of folks have a spare bedroom, a camper/motorhome in the driveway or those that live in condos often have guest suites available at a very reasonable rate. We need to compile a list of possible free or low-cost accommodations for each club and make it available to our travelling players.

Billeting someone does not mean you have to feed them. It is just a place for them to sleep and possibly have a shower. It is also a great way to get to know players from somewhere else and a great way to make new friends. Even a one day tournament could bring in more players if they could stay a night for free or reasonable cost, and not have to rush back home the same day.

For those clubs that now have to pay for the use of the courts, they may be able to a little more for entry fees and use some of the money to cover that cost.

Please consider this suggestion as we all want to continue pitching shoes, meeting new people, making new friends and having fun.

Victoria is hosting the first ever Team tournament. It is a 4-person team but you can have up to 2 extra players as spares. Ideally, we will have 6 team divisions so each team will play 5 other teams.

Each match will be worth 4 pts - one point for each game won by your player. Games will be shoe limits. Matchups will be determined by a coin toss. The losing team will place their players on 4 assigned courts and the other team will decide the match up of players. Lots of strategy involved.

Tournament is limited to 24 teams. There will be some teams playing in the morning and some in the afternoon.

Cost is \$80 per team (\$20 per player).
