STATS FROM THE BC CHAMPIONSHIPS

106 Pitchers in 19 classes pitched in this two day tournament. 42,656 shoes were pitched, 12,843 ringers were recorded. The average ringer percentage was 30.10%. The highest recorded was by Neil Yaskow 64.45%

JUNIORS

77.27% was the highest game and was thrown by Mathew Macdonald.
Biggest increase was from 5.32% to 11.39% by Cheyann Newman (An increase of 6.07%)

LADIES

79.16% was the highest game and was thrown by Elyse Brunelle.
Biggest increase was from 45.49% to 50.24% by Carol Ormiston (An increase of 4.75%)

ELDERS

77.77% was the highest game and was thrown by Neil Yaskow.
Biggest increase was from 24.89% to 34.63% by Brian Warburton (An increase of 9.74%)

MEN

70.83% was the highest game and was thrown by Roy Dawe.
Biggest increase was from 29.29% to 32.59% by Fred Ormiston (An increase of 3.30%)

JUNIORS CLASS A

Mathew Macdonald retained his junior boy's title, losing only one game, that being to runner up Sam Degraaf.

Jessica Degraaf retained her junior girl's title.

JUNIORS CLASS B

Two relatively new participants fought it out for the junior girl's B and C titles. Cheyann Newman (Quesnel) won the B title with Nicole Dabney (Dry Creek) taking the C title.

MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

After the first day of play Tom Balazs (Victoria) was rolling along with a 5-0 record and averaging 54%. On the Sunday Tom hung on for dear life, even though he only lost one game, his percentage dropped to 45.47%. This marks Tom's first title as the BC Men's Provincial Champion. This will allow Tom to automatically qualify into the Championship Class for the next year.

Finishing second was the always steady Al Gushta (Kamloops), third went to Roy Dawe and finishing first was Allan Cummings (Central Park).

MEN'S B CLASS

In a tough fought play-off game Lou Busch (Nanaimo) defeated Les Anderson (Provincial) for the B class title. Finishing third was Paul Onyschschuk (Dry Creek with fourth going to Ron Degraaf (Cloverdale).

MENS C CLASS

This years C class winner is Esko Karlson (Prince George), 2nd going to Fred Ormiston (Victoria and BCHA Vice-President), 3rd place went to Trevor Greveling and 4th place was taken by Herb Boschman (Prince George)

MENS D CLASS

According to the first place finisher Chris Macdonald (Victoria) if it was not for Jim Gallant he would not have won, whatever that is supposed to mean. Second place was taken by Kevin Scallon (Kamloops).

MENS E CLASS

In his first season of playing horseshoes, Jim Grant (Cloverdale) took first place, 2nd place went to Frank Hubick (Powell River).

LADIES CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

After the first day of play, Elyse Brunelle (Central Park) and Viviann Fendle (Penticton) had identical records of 3-1. On day two Elyse lost to Carol Ormiston. Could Elyse retain her title, it all came down to the final round, if Elyse wins she forces a play-off with Viviann, if Viviann wins we would have a new champion. When the dust settled and the final show was pitched Elyse retained her title by defeating Viviann. This was Elyse's 8th title out of the last nine years. Third place went to Carol Ormiston (Victoria), Carol previously won the title back in 1997.

LADIES B CLASS

Doris Wilton (Winfield), previous provincial champ on four occasions, has started play again after taking several years away from the game. Congratulations Doris on winning the B title. Second place was taken by the always excitable Juanita Laye (Summerland) with third going to Lorraine Hubick (Powell River)

LADIES C CLASS

Joy Osborne (Victoria) won the class with second and third place going to Deb Turner (Victoria) and Cheryl Brietkopf (Quesnel).

LADIES D CLASS

A victory for another player from Winfield, Debbie Vincent, two games behind was Margaret Onyschschuk, third went to Helene Boudreau (Quesnel).

LADIES E CLASS

The top three winners in this class are all from the interior.

First place went to Verna Weingardt (Winfield) who went undefeated 10-1, second was Muriel Scallon (Kamloops) and third went to Sharon Lagarde (Summerland).

LADIES F CLASS

Benita Karlson from Prince George won the class (guess no bragging rights are in the family as Esko won the men's C class), second went to Annette Hughes (Winfield) and third was Sandra Hansen (Powell River).

ELDERS 30 FT CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

Neil Yaskow (Maple Ridge) seems to be the man to beat in the Elders class, this was Neil's 5th title in six years, an undefeated record of 9-0, high game of 77.77% and the high average of 64.45 propelled him to the title. In second place was Don Morgan (Winfield) and third went to Murray Rayner (Nanaimo).

ELDERS 30 FT B CLASS

Ernie Connolly from Winfield defeated Darryl Olsen (Abbotsford) to win the title, in third place was Jim Millar from Victoria.

ELDERS 30 FT C CLASS

As the case in a lot of tournaments, average may mean nothing, wins and loses is what matters, this was the case in this class. George Pater (Vernon) finished first and yet had the 5th best ringer percentage, go figure. Second went to John Barrett (Nicola Valley) and third went to John Thornton (Winfield).

ELDERS 30 FT D CLASS

After a three way tie for first, Ozzie Leaf (Vernon) won the class with Brian Ryder (Provincial) placing second and in third place was Ted Peters (Salmon Arm).

ELDERS 30 FT E CLASS

Brian Warburton (Penticton) walked away with this class, Cliff Bailey (Winfield) finished second and third went to Lionel Hanson (Powell River).

ELDERS 30 FT E CLASS

Winning the title after being away for over a year with various injuries was Garry Rayner (Provincial), second place went to Bill Flannigan (Summerland) and in third place was Bud Perry (Penticton).

The 2010 BC Championships will be held in Prince George.

The membership dues for 2010 will now be \$14.00 per adult member; this was a result of Horseshoe Canada increasing their dues from \$1.00 to \$2.00 per member.

Dorothy Butts was inducted into the BC Horseshoe Hall Of Fame as Organizer/Promoter, a well deserving award.

BC HORSESHOE ASSOCIATION HALL OF FAME 2009 INDUCTEE – DOROTHY BUTTS (VICTORIA)

Dorothy's Accomplishments:

Local Level:

Dorothy joined the Victoria Horseshoe Club in 1982 and was Treasurer of the ladies section for 4 years.

She was elected President of the Victoria Horseshoe Club from 2000-2004 and continues to serve on many committees, especially fund raising.

She was co-coordinator for 3 Canadian Championships: 1994, 1998 and 2004.

She was one of the main organizers to do a complete renovation of the courts (for the 1994 Canadian Championships), a fantastic job.

Provincial Level:

Dorothy was elected Secretary of the BCHA in the late 1980's and has held the position of

President and Past President.

As secretary, she rewrote the association constitution and that enabled the association to be re-instated under the Society Act of BC.

She was able to arrange for a computer tournament program to be used for many tournaments.

She established an effective communication link with all member clubs in the province.

National Level:

Dorothy was a BC delegate at many Horseshoe Canada AGM's and was very active in many resolutions presented.

Dorothy was Secretary of Horseshoe Canada for a 2 year term and was Treasurer for 4 years.

She is currently the National Awards Director.

Dorothy competed in club, provincial and national championships from 1984-2000. Her best showing at the Canadians was 9th in 1988 and 7th in 1997.

Rheumatoid arthritis has curtailed her pitching, but she continues to be active in promoting the sport.

We are pleased and honored to induct Dorothy Butts into the BCHA Hall Of Fame.

FROM NICK CULIC – SUMMERLAND

I have some memories to share with you and every one who loves "Horseshoes"

I put on my thinking cap, and came upon something that will stay in my memory forever I think!

I call this piece "You look after my club, you hear"

The year was 2000, I was fairly green in the game of horseshoes, that was the first time I met Tal Severson at our club.

Most of you knew Tal who in the 80's was B.C Champ more than once, and a contender many times over and he loved to teach people the love of his sport! This big Viking was giving me a rough time, whenever we would get together at the pits whatever I was doing was wrong, or just not good enough! But since we belonged to the same club we had to get along. Couple of years went by, Tal's knees started to get bad, and he was throwing a foot short of the post.

I made the mistake once of mentioning for him to move up to 30ft. Well, that didn't go over too well, he barked at me "I played from the beginning 40 ft. and I will end it as a 40 footer."

I also remember one more incident with Tal, it was early summer 2004, a young man working downtown Summerland decided to come join us in the park and play, Tal was there in a flash, showing him the ropes. At the end of the game he handed this stranger his favorite shoes, I believe they were "Elmer Hohl's"

What I had witnessed was the end of a career of one of the best of us,! Towards the end of that summer when I saw Tal at practice, he did not look healthy, he told us he was moving to Quesnel, where his daughter lived. We shook hands and he told me "Nick you look after my club you hear".

It was summer 2006, B.C Championship in Quesnel. Joe Belanger and I decided to go, and who should be there opening the Tournament, Tal Severson of course! When he spotted us he came over and with tears in his eyes gave us a fatherly hug. He told us to do great for his favorite club. We both did just that and at the end of that Tournie, we said our goodbyes again and I somehow knew that would be the last time. Tal passed away December 2008 in Quesnel.

RULES FOR RUNNING SANCTIONED TOURNAMENTS

1. At the time of check-in each player registered in a tournament must show upon request by the Tournament Director(s) a valid paid up Horseshoe Canada Card or a valid paid up National Horseshoe Pitchers Association Card.

2. PERCENTAGE

Players' averages shall be used from those provided by the B.C. Horseshoe Association statistician. An updated percentage shall be sent to each club in a timely manner.

If a player does not have an existing average than he/she shall pitch 50 shoes, with a pacer, prior to the date of the sanctioned tournament.

If a club has a league and keeps records than that players percentage can be used, provided it is verified and confirmed by the clubs statistician.

Players averages for tournaments shall be based on your three (3) best tournaments over the past 365 days or best three (3) out of your last ten (10) tournaments, whichever occurs first.

4. MIXED TOURNAMENTS – shall be advertised as such.

5 The number of players in a class shall be left up to the tournament committee. Wherever possible please try to keep classes no more than 10% difference from the top player to the bottom player.

If a club has a two-day tournament the number of games to be played shall be left to the discretion of the tournament committee.

6 Unless otherwise stated all playing rules as issued by Horseshoe Canada shall be used.

- 7 All funds derived from entry fees and added monies (if any) shall be returned to the tournament in the form of prize money.
8. All entry fees collected shall remain in the class they are collected for. Transferring of entry fees from one class to another shall not be permitted.
9. All classes shall be designated as A,B,C,D, etc. with “A” being the highest class.
10. PAYOUT OF PRIZE MONEY ARE AS FOLLOWS:
 1. 10-12 PLAYERS IN A CLASS
 - 1st place - 40% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 - 2nd place - 30% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 - 3rd place - 20% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 - 4th place - 10% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 2. 5-9 PLAYERS IN A CLASS
 - 1st place - 50% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 - 2nd place - 30% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 - 3rd place - 20% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 3. 3-4 PLAYERS IN A CLASS
 - 1st place - 60% of entry fee plus added money (if any)
 - 2nd place - 40% of entry fee plus added money (if any)

11. A prize list should be posted for all participants to see shortly after the tournament has started.
12. If weather conditions hamper the tournament, all play shall be delayed for a period of time as determined by the tournament director(s).

13. Clubs holding tournaments shall have the following:

Capable people to run computer program to do tournament statistics
Provide capable scorekeepers

OR

Capable people to run master sheets.

Capable people to calculate percentages.

Capable people to check score sheets.

Provide capable score keepers.

People to write up summary sheets to be submitted to the statistician of the B.C. Horseshoe Association.

Runners to collect score sheets from score keepers. If no runner is available then the winner of the game shall submit the score sheet to the tournament statistician.

Shall have a visible scoring system, i.e. scoreboards

NOTE: When calculating a player's average for a tournament takes his/her total ringers pitched and divide this by the total number of shoes pitched. Do not add the players' percentages together and divide by the number of games played, this can result in a 2-3% difference.

14, JUDGES - Shall be appointed by the tournament committee. Judges shall decide points when contestants are in doubt. A judge may consult another judge if he/she is in doubt. A judge shall never consult the players. A judge's decision shall be final and no protests may be lodged.

All protests by players shall be reported to the judge. If the judge cannot make a decision then the judge shall present the protest to the tournament director(s).

Only judges can call fouls – not scorekeepers.

All measurements by a judge shall be made with straight edges and/or callipers and not by any other object.

15. SCOREKEEPERS - The job of the scorekeeper shall be to keep score. The scorekeepers shall not make measurements when a shoe is in doubt that is the responsibility of the judge.

The scorekeeper shall oblige by the same rules as a player, when asked what the score is he/she shall show the player(s) the score sheet, score keepers are not to announce the score or utter any sound when either of the players are in a pitching motion.

A scorekeeper shall be a neutral person and shall not encourage or discourage any of the players.

When requested by the players, the scorekeeper shall remove dead shoes from the playing area.

The scorekeeper shall total all score sheets including single points prior to the score sheet being presented to the tournament statistician.

THE SCORE KEEPER SHALL SIGN ALL SCORE SHEETS.

16. If there are insufficient courts available there will be a 10 minute warm up period for those classes starting next (this is the official rule)

Only those players playing in the current time period shall be permitted on the courts. i.e. - if you are not playing until the next shift you cannot practice in between games when the morning shift is playing.

17. All play-off games shall count in calculating player's averages.
18. DRESS CODE – As per standard Horseshoe Canada and NHPA standards, a neat and tidy appearance along with your clubs shirt and your last name on the back of the shirt.
19. All ties (except for 1st place) shall be determined by ringer percentage. Ties for 1st place shall be broken as follows:
 1. Two players tied - one game
 2. Three players tied:

The player with the highest ringer percentage after regulation play shall receive a bye. The next two players shall play one game sudden death. The player who loses this game shall get 3rd place and the winner shall play the player receiving the bye a one game sudden death to determine 1st and 2nd places.
 3. Four players tied:

The players ringer percentages after regulation play shall be listed in ringer percentage from highest to lowest 1,2,3,4. The player with the highest ringer percentage shall play the player with the lowest average one game sudden death. The players with the 2nd and 3rd ringer percentages shall play one game sudden death. The two winners of the above games shall play one game sudden death to determine who shall finish 1st and 2nd. The two losers of the above games shall play one game sudden death to determine who shall finish 3rd and 4th.
 4. Five players tied:

The players ringer percentages after regulation play shall be listed in ringer percentage from highest to lowest 1,2,3,4,5. Players 4 and 5 shall play one game sudden death and the resultant winner shall now be designated player #4. Players 1 and 4; players 2 and 3 now play one game sudden death. The two winners of the above games play one game sudden death for 1st and 2nd place. The two losers play one game sudden death to determine 3rd and 4th place.
20. All play-off games shall be played in the same manner as in the regular round robin play unless predetermined by the tournament director(s).
21. Any ties (other than for first place) but are for paying position that cannot be resolved by percentage shall be played off. Example – 2 players are tied for 3rd place and have the same ending percentage and wins and losses after regulation play.
22. Handicapping of classes for the Lower Mainland, Interior/North/Kootneys and Island Championships, BC International and BC Championships shall not be permitted as these are championship events.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Pre-registration shall be up to the host club. However, it is recommended to have at least 24 hours pre-registration.
2. The entry fee for sanctioned tournaments shall be up to the host club.
3. If there is added money at any sanctioned tournament the distribution of the said funds shall be left up to the discretion of the tournament committee.
4. The following point structure is recommended as a guideline
 1. All "A" and "B" classes 40 point games
 2. All "C" classes 35 point games
 3. All "D" and "E" classes 30 point games
 4. All other classes 25 point games and or 40 shoes or 50 shoes
5. All score keepers shall be paid a fee from each player per game as determined by the tournament director(s). The host club shall be responsible for paying score keepers for juniors.
6. Handicapping of classes for regular run tournaments (Not Championship tournaments, see rule above) is permitted but should be advertised in advance.

NATSTATS/CANSTATS files must substantiate that you have pitched a minimum of four (4) sanctioned events in the preceding twelve (12) months, at your divisions pitching distance, prior to May 13th 2010, which is the last date NATSTATS will accept results to determine entering averages. You may enter at anytime prior to May 13th. All averages used will be the average on record in NATSTATS/CANSTATS on May 13th 2010. Entry fees received before April 1st 2010 will be held until that date.

READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the **OPEN MEN'S DIVISION** regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the **OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION**. To enter the **SENIOR DIVISION**, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2010. Any man that turns 70 years of age in 2010 or is older or physically impaired person of any age may enter the **ELDER MEN'S DIVISION**. **JUNIOR DIVISION** entrants must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2010 calendar year.

Note # 1. A Social Security number is required from all pitchers that move up to the Championship Classes. Except Juniors.

Note # 2. A minimum of 48 must enter this division or it will be canceled and all entrants will be placed in the Open Women.

Note # 3. Junior Cadets must be 9 years old or younger for the entire calendar year.
