This is an incredible chance to preserve a unique piece of New England organ building history as this organ is perhaps the oldest remaining instrument by George Stevens. There are two unaltered 1840s Stevens organs in Maine that illustrate the unique and beautiful tonal qualities of this Stevens when it is fully restored. Suspected of having been built between 1835 and 1840, the organ last served in the Unitarian, later Community, Church of South Windham, ME. The organ is currently stored in our shop awaiting a detailed restoration.
