

Communion on Sunday October 4th

On Sunday October 4, we will continue with virtual communion on the first Sunday of every month. The communion service will be part of the regular worship service and will include a service of confession and forgiveness as well as the regular communion liturgy. There are three ways you can prepare of that service. First you can gather wine and some form of bread in your own home to use during the service. If that is not possible, you can come to the church during regular office hours to pick up prepackaged individual communion servings for each member of your family. Finally, if you are not able to come to church, you can call the office and volunteers will deliver the communion servings to you home.

Sunday October 4th is also World Communion Sunday. World Communion Sunday offers congregations a distinctive opportunity to experience Holy Communion in the context of the global community of faith. The first Sunday of October has become a time when Christians in every culture break bread and pour the cup to remember and affirm Christ as the Head of the Church. On that day, they remember that they are part of the whole body of believers. Whether shared in a grand cathedral, a mud hut, outside on a hilltop, in a meetinghouse, or in a storefront, Christians celebrate the communion liturgy in as many ways as there are congregations. World Communion Sunday can be both a profound worship experience and a time for learning more about our wider community of faith.

The MSP is filled out by leaders within the congregation or organization, under the guidance of the synod bishop or Call Process Administrator. Once completed and submitted, the MSP will be stored within the ELCA's Mobility Database System.

The Eleva Lutheran MSP has been submitted and is ready to be reviewed by potential candidates for a call as pastor. <u>Call to Order</u>: The August 10, 2020, meeting of the Eleva Lutheran Church Council was called to order at 6:35 p.m. by President Jessica Franck.

New Business:

CAT update

A 2-hour CAT survey update was given by our consultant, Kurt Jacobson.

The Council discussed our Pastoral Compensation package, as we move forward in the call process. The Council discussed that we want to keep these provisions from the 2013 proposal: solo pastor to serve our congregation Master's degree

over 3 years of experience Parsonage offered

4 weeks of vacation

Social Security tax off-set sabbatical policy background check continuing education covered

Mike Lueloff made a motion to approve these provisions, seconded by Bill Smith. Motion carried.

<u>Old Business</u>: Jessica Franck reported that Eleva Lutheran's Amazon Smile account is up and running – so anytime you shop on Amazon, part of your order goes towards raising funds for Eleva Lutheran! Jessica Franck also brought up our work towards an outdoor service in the future. At this point, there will be no outdoor service, due to spiking numbers of COVID-19 in our area. The Council will revisit this idea again at our September meeting.

Pastor Tom discussed the idea of a live stream communion as an option to connect members of the congregation. Doing this in a live stream format may be a bit more engaging. This could also be accessible through our phone system for call-in worship. The Council supports this, as many people have been missing the connection of communion. We discussed the option of either ordering communion kits or making our own for those interested. In the future, we may also consider a worship sign-up sheet for 3-5 people at a time to come to the recordings of the worship. In this way, members would be also to worship in the space. However, we will hold off on this plan until numbers decrease.

Pastor Bob discussed some options for Confirmation in October. One option would entail family groups in the church. Each student could sign up for a time, with immediate family only, wearing masks. If this option is pursued there will be cleaning and sanitizing in between families. We could also set up an outdoor service, if need be. Jessica will consult with the Worship Committee to get their thoughts. Jessica Franck reported that there are no updates on Sunday School, but they will continue to discuss options. Corey Peterson mentioned getting some estimates on an updated heating and cooling system for the church.

Reports: All monthly reports will be tabled until next month for discussion and review. **Next Council Meeting**: The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, September 14, 2020, at 6:30 p.m.

A motion was made by Jessica Franck to close the meeting, seconded by Kim Flaherty. Motion carried to adjourn at 9:30 p.m. We closed with a Prayer.
