Greetings Friends!

As we bid farewell to February, and say hello to March, we are in the midst of the Lenten season. During Lent we find ourselves in the “not yet”, the liminal space, between what was and what will be. As individuals and as a faith community we walk the journey of Lent, from Ash Wednesday until Easter morning. As a congregation, this Lent has special significance.

During the Annual Meeting last month, the budget that was approved included funding for a full-time staff position. The two broad brush strokes of the job are youth shepherd and office administrator. While it may seem like this came out of the blue, the reality is that the writing has been on the wall for some time. When I first arrived, we gathered for listening sessions and last summer the Dream Team gathered to vision about our future ministry direction. The single common thread running through all of those listening sessions and meetings was **YOUTH**. Many of the informal conversations that I have with people contain the same subject, **YOUTH**.

Before I was called as your pastor, in 2020, you completed the *“Congregational Assessment Tool”*. The top priority identified: **Make necessary changes to attract families with children and youth to our church.**

I know that when things change, even when it’s for the better, it can be frightening and can cause us to experience grief. I want to honor our collective feelings of fear, anxiety, and grief, and name them. We all have questions, “What if we can’t raise the money?” “How will we manage?” “What if we can’t find someone who has all these gifts?” “Why can’t some one step up and volunteer like before?” “Why do kids stop coming to church after confirmation?” “What is going to happen?” “Why can’t church be the way it was when I was a kid?” It’s natural to ask these kinds of questions or have thoughts along these lines. I invite you to recognize the emotion behind the questions that you have. And I want to encourage you not to get stuck there! Please try to keep these first, knee-jerk questions from monopolizing your emotional bandwidth!

You were talking about youth ministry before I came and we have been talking about this since my arrival. We have taken the first step toward changing our words into an action. The Holy Spirit has called us to this ministry and now we have the opportunity to embody our desire to support young people in faith formation and walk alongside them on their faith journeys.

Approving the budget was the easy part, now we begin developing a job description with clear

expectations. Then the search to find a qualified person with the gifts to thrive in this unique position. **Please pray!** Pray for the young people in our community. Pray for the person who will be called to ELC and the ministry of shepherding the youth and administrating the office. Pray to discover your role in supporting this ministry.

We need to be diligent and conscientious in our discernment and trust God with all our hearts to guide the process and trust the Spirit to nudge the right person in our direction!

AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM (Confirmation) Update and Info

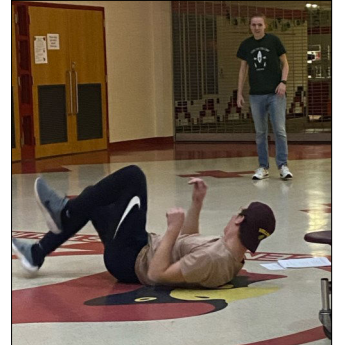
First I want to thank all of the students gathered for a night of fun together at the Lock-in with the Luther Park staff. And for leading worship on Sunday, February 19th. You all did a great job!!

During Lent there will not be any confirmation classes, students are expected to attend the mid-week Lenten services on March 1st, 8th, 15th, 22nd, and 29th. Soup is served at 5:30 with worship at 6:30. There will be a sign-up sheet on my office door to let me know that you were present at the worship service. You can write sermon notes for *two* of the Wednesday Lenten services. You can write sermon notes for ANY and ALL Sundays.

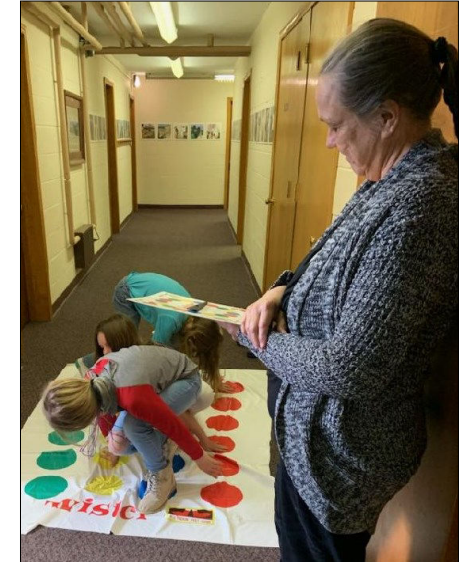
Here is the schedule for after Lent:

- April 5th, the 8th graders will present their chosen bible verse and we will discuss their faith statements. I will meet with each student individually. (No class for 7th graders)
- April 12th, Tying quilts for graduating seniors. I will need additional help from parents for this service event!
- April 19th, Luther's catechism and general review
- April 26th, Luther's small catechism and review continue. **First draft of faith statements need to be submitted for review and revision. (Completed faith statements need to be turned in and approved by me before May 10th.)**
- May 3rd, End of year celebration Pizza Party. Bring your favorite board or card game to enjoy. All sermon notes are due.
- May 7th, Senior Recognition Day, quilts will be given during the Sunday morning worship service. It would be wonderful if some of the people that helped tie quilts could come and present them to the seniors during the worship service.
- May 10th, for any 8th graders who have not submitted the final draft of their faith statements.
- May 17th, Rehearsal: We will work out the logistics for the worship service and practice. If the parents of the students affirming their baptism would like to attend to see what role you will play at the worship service you are welcome!
- May 21st, Affirmation of Baptism during the Sunday morning worship service. Parents and family members will be invited to come to the rail when their child is affirming their baptism. It will be an exciting day!

Lent and Easter Theme: “Unfinished”

The season of Lent has begun and will take us through the month of March until Easter Sunday on April 9th. We will be exploring the theme “Unfinished” during both the mid-week Lenten services and Sunday mornings.

“Unfinished-Out of the Depths”: During the mid-week Lenten services we will be delving into the Book of Jonah. Jonah walks a Lenten path. Like all human beings, he is prone to wander from his Creator in favor of determining the shape and scope of his own future. This temptation is especially powerful when God calls us to take on risky ventures, travel to strange places, and confront things inside of us that prevent us from seeing one another as God does. God meets us in those liminal, Lent-like spaces when we find ourselves somewhere between trust and doubt, courage and fear, anger and empathy.

“Unfinished-Discovering God’s Call in the Not Yet”: Author and life coach Nancy Levin writes, “Honor the space between no longer and not yet”. We can probably all think of a host of experiences from our own lives in which we occupy the space between no longer and not yet. The space between no longer pre-pandemic life and not yet what will settle into post-pandemic life. The space between before and after a medical diagnosis, before and after living with a loss, before and after navigating a relationship change, a job change, a move. The space between childhood and adulthood, young adulthood and midlife, midlife and the autumn years. The space between yesterday and tomorrow, your comfort zone and uncharted territory. The space between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday.

The church by its very nature, and we as people of faith, live our whole lives in the space between no longer and not yet. Cross-marked and Spirit-sealed, we dwell in the space between the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and the final fulfillment of God’s hope-filled promises. In this space between, we dwell in the unfinished as unfinished people. As John reminds us, “we are God’s children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed.”

But we are not left alone in this space between no longer and not yet. We are not left alone to navigate this unfinished life by ourselves. God is here—present-tense, each and every day—calling to us, accompanying us, renewing and recreating us—over and over again.
