

Under 13's

Last Week was Indigenous round, this is highly significant for our game, with its roots in the tribal game Marn Grook. The "inventors" of our game are thought to have witnessed as children the gathering of tribes who came together to compete. The concept was borrowed and developed into the game we play today.

Indigenous round starts with a welcome to country. We have two descendants of the Darumbal People, the original inhabitants of the Rockhampton area, in our team. Psalmoi and Reggi delivered the Welcome to Country. Just as some of the best players of this game at AFL level are indigenous, our indigenous players excelled last week, with Xavier and Ernie fierce at the contest.

The last few week's events in U13's football got me thinking about the much discussed "spirit of the game". A definition I found suggests: **Spirit of the Game**. *Ultimate relies upon a spirit of sportsmanship that places the responsibility for fair play on the players and officials. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of mutual respect among competitors, adherence to the agreed upon rules, or the basic joy of play*.
